

#### **Project Summary**

Bal Sansar Sanstha (BSS) plans to

- 1. provide quality primary education to 200 girls from the rural poor families, most parents are daily wage laborers
- 2. building school infrastructure (i.e. 6 classrooms, library, 1 computer Lab, 4 toilets for the girls) to provide standard school amenities to these girls in Ajmer, Rajasthan, India,

allowing girls to postpone their age of marriage, not to get pushed into child-labor, rise out of poverty, providing their families' health & well-being.

#### Bal Sansar Public School (BSPS) since April 2013 (2)



#### **Bal Sansar Public School aims to:**

- provide quality pre & primary education to rural children in Ajmer district; gradually to upgrade up to elementary & then senior secondary levels.
- our pre-school education is a school readiness programme with development of multiple intelligences of children with age appropriate physical and life-skill activities, cognitive training of senses and creativity of children.
- ✓ BSPS will attempts to provide culturally sensitive, environment friendly quality education leading to all-round development opportunities to its students (who mostly come from economically weaker section and many are even first generation learners in their families).

#### The issue, problem, or challenge (3)



- Big rural urban & gender divide deprives girls; access, retention & quality of education are key concerns;
- Female literacy rate in Rajasthan 24.44% (1991) 43.9% (2001) 52.66% (2011) far below to national rates & the goal of Education for All;
- Girls not attending schools regularly;
- low value given to the girl child, child marriage & child labor prevails.
- Drop-out rates are high at secondary level, at elementary level 7.06 and at secondary level 31.48 (2010-11).
- Also, there are resource constraints

#### How will this project solve this problem (4)



#### Bal Sansar Public School will ensure

- community & parent contact and counseling ensuring families give due importance to education of girls;
- quality of teaching & learning;
- teacher sensitization;
- creating girls' friendly school;
- safe transportation;
- life-skill program, inclusion of health & hygiene issues;
   all these will enhance confidence level of girls (their parents as well), ensuring that they stay in school, not pushed in to child marriage, child labor & continue their education, leading quality life



### **Project Status (5)**

BSPS started with just four; today a full-fledged English medium primary school caters to 117 students in Ajmer, Rajasthan, India.

The growing enrolment is a testimony of quality teaching, appreciated by the students and parents. Requested donations will help accommodating 200 girls by new session.

#### **Potential Long Term Impact (6)**



- The project will educate 200 rural poor girls allowing them to postpone their age of marriage, not to get pushed into child labor, rise out of poverty, which will provide for themselves as well as their families' health and well-being.
- These early investments in the lives of young girls will go a long way impacting the overall quality of their lives while influencing their & family's mind-sets, dreams, aspirations & future potentials.

#### Requested Funding Amount: \$50000 (7)

#### Critical Mass of Empowered Adolescents

- 60 Taiyari Samoohs, comprising of 1800 empowered adolescents formed in 30 GPs in project area.

- ✓ 'Sambal' Skill and Entrepreneurship Development Institute (SEDI) for the rural youth: in Ajmer district, since April 2013.
- ✓ we envision SEDI as an institute where rural youth enhance their skills to explore various livelihood options leading their life with dignity.
- ✓ it's an evolving project, initiated with infrastructure development plans, aiming to accommodate 100 trainees at one point of time
- ✓ with a target coverage of (3 Lakh) 30% of the rural youth population in Ajmer, in next 5 years.
- ✓ we have the land and need to mobilize 6 Crore to build infrastructure, engage faculty and run SEDI operations.

Networking & Capacity Building Support to CBOs & NGOs (from 2006-Continued). Supported so far:

- Sehat Samooh (PLHA NGO) Sarthak (MSM CBO) for getting registered, building capacity of board members, mobilizing resources, linking them with other agencies/NGOs.
- Our hand-holding processes enabled Sehat Samooh to run programs such as Truckers' TI, funded by RSACS under the NACP- III.

- The total registered and benefitted people living with HIV (PLHIV) till March 2013 are 2253 (1287 men, 961 women (with a break-up of 199 widows, 5 Transgender, 163 children: i.e. 102 boys, 61 girls).
- A care facility linking PLHA with ARTC in Ajmer district, Rajasthan, India.
- One of its kind CCC in a rural settings in the Northern India, supported by PLHA, PRIs,
- CSOs and the local communities.
- Land donated by a senior citizen. Infrastructure development through private donations, corporate charities & support from elected representatives.
- Supported by Global Fund for AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria (GFMAT) through Population Foundation of India (PFI), Principal Recipient & Hindustan Latex Family Planning Promotion Trust (HLFPPT) Sub Recipient, BSS was Sub-Sub Recipient.



Sneh Sansar: Hindi word that literally translates to 'loving World', attempted to:

- offer a safe shelter with basic amenities, love & care to the children orphaned (including the AIDS affected). We aimed to:
- build and strengthen social, ethical, and spiritual values.
- make them know that they are important, loved and supported to lead a meaningful life.
- help them in regaining confidence while appreciating their life in Sneh Sansar by partaking in counseling and therapy programs.

Completed 8, 9, 10 level formal education

Supported by the individual donors & Inner Wheel Club, Family trusts in Ajmer.

More such children can be supported by education, vocational skills, food, clothes, medical-psycho-social care, safe shelter by getting needed generous donor support



### Key Projects Accomplished (2003-2010), cont...



- "Transitional Education Centres (TECs), supported by International Labour Organization (ILO) - National Child Labour Project (NCLP) Society Jaipur-GoR (2002-03). All the enrolled 250 children completed primary level education and mainstreamed for further continuing their formal education.
- SHGs comprising 220 mothers of the children enrolled in TECs aiming enhanced earning opportunities of mothers, by providing them training in selected trades (2002-03).
- 'Behavior Change Communication (BCC); a pilot project addressing communication needs of adolescents and young adults in 20 villages of Niwai & Tonk blocks of Tonk district, supported by UNICEF Rajasthan (2006).
- ✓ Designed, field tested and developed target group (15-25 age) specific communication modes/materials addressing communication needs of the youth, adolescents and young people increasing knowledge levels and inculcate positive attitudes, behaviours and practices.
- ✓ Conducted 40 each Nukkar Natak, Puppet shows, Audio-Video shows in 20 villages, covering 13001 rural youth audiences.

### Key Projects Accomplished (2003-2010), cont...



- Mobilizing Community Structures to Support Integrated Health, Nutrition and Education Outcomes through BCC and Social Change in 33 GramPanchayats of Uniyara Block, Tonk District -supported by UNICEF Rajasthan (Oct. 2009 to Jan. 10). Trained 33 VHSCs, 291 members. Formed 33 Meena Manch, trained 616 participants (534 adolescent girls, 30ASAHs, 52 AWWs). Conducted a study assessing status of JSY in 33 Gram Panchayats.
- 'IEC through Radio programmes', in 100 villages of Ajmer, a PFI-UNDP-NACO supported project, 2009-10. Formed 100 Rural Women Listeners Clubs, reached 14670 members.
- · 'Awareness Generation Programme', CSWB supported project in Ajmer, 2009-10. Trained 169 rural poor women in the five project villages namely: Chosala, Devpuri, Dholpuria, Bhogadeet and Dorai. Eight days camp covering issues of social, cultural and economic importance, women empowerment, gender, legal rights and PRIs; with a two day follow-up camps.
- For last 9 years, successfully participated in HIV-AIDS programs with network partners and as a result, on behalf of the employer agency, the Chairperson has been part of National AIDS Control Program (NACP) phase-III planning and design process and nominated a member of the:
  - Working group on GIPA, Legal and Ethical Issues for developing NACP-III. · Technical Resource Group (TRG) for the TIs at NACO.

- Our team consists of about 32 full time (20 male and 12 female) and 41 part-time (19 male and 23 female) hard working, dedicated individuals, working wholeheartedly for the social cause.
- In addition to the above staff multidisciplinary team having social science, community development, health, education, HIV-AIDS and medical background is available as per organization's need.
- All the EC members are reputed professionals in their respective fields and their expert services are also available to the NGO.
- There are about 60 Community Volunteers in Ajmer and Tonk districts supporting programme activities as and when needed.
- Project specific teams are being hired depending on the need and recourse availability.
