Impact so far

- Reached 35,598 children through our work
- Helped 95 schools to improve their school environment, teaching skills and their ability to keep children safe.
- Empowered 12,000 pupils to stand up for child rights
- In schools we have worked in, an average 79% of pupils pass their primary school leaving exams, compared to 64% 4 years ago. The rate of children attending class is now 92%, compared with 83%, 4 years ago.
- School farming has provided 16,196 children with school meals

Who are we

Childreach Tanzania is a locally registered charity based in Moshi, Kilimanjaro. We operate at the grassroots level, working in partnership with government primary schools and local communities to implementsustainable, community led initiatives.

What we do

We make primary schools brighter child-friendly and healthier

We improve schools by renovating and building new infrastructures, including classrooms, toilets, kitchens, teachers' houses, dining halls and playgrounds. We also improve sanitation by providing water wells, rain water harvesting systems and connection to mains water.

We empower children to advocate for their rights

Through child-to-child clubs, children are taught and empowered to advocate and lobby for their rights with key decision makers. Platforms are created for children to meet with and air their views to key decision makers.



We link schools and teach children global awareness

Children in Tanzania and children in the UK engage in mutual learning. They increase their awareness on global issues, as well as the awareness of others around the world.

We provide participatory and child-centered workshops

These are conducted in schools to increase children's confidence and to give them an opportunity to air their views and opinions.

We help schools to provide lunches from their farms

Grain and vegetables are grown on school farms and used to provide lunch and improve children's nutritional intake. Parents and the community are taught sustainable farming techniques which can be applied in their own farms.

We help deaf youths to get an education and to gain skills

Through our deaf education and development programme, we encourage the enrolment of deaf children into schools and give sign language training to improve communication between deaf children, teachers and parents. We provide vocational skills such as tailoring and carpentry to enable deaf youth to earn an income in the future. We advocate for the rights of deaf children and young adults.

We light up family homes by installing 'Litre of Light'

An innovative and cheap technology reliant on sunlight. Bottles of water are installed in households which do not have access to electricity to provide light in the house during day time. The Litre of Light makes their household chores easier and reduces kerosene costs. Solar torches are provided for night time use which enables children to do their homework in the house at night.

We create awareness to the pastoralist communities on consuming more diversified foods

Our new project Maisha Bora in partnership with UN-WFP aims at helping households, in particular pregnant and lactating women and children under 5, to consume more diversified foods, use cleaner water, prevent and treat diarrhoea effectively and have increased awareness of HIV prevention.
