

WOMEN EMPOWERMENT

Recognizing that empowerment is key for women to overcome barriers and embrace leadership in a male-dominated society, RSKS India has taken the lead in driving change. This year, the organization carried out impactful initiatives focused on uplifting women, strengthening their voices, and fostering long-term empowerment.

Stop Violence Against Women

Violence against women was one of the gravest violations of human rights, depriving women and girls of dignity, security, and equal opportunities.

Recognizing this, RSKS India, launched the project "Her Voice: Stop Violence Against Women." The initiative worked at the grassroots to challenge harmful social norms, raise awareness about issues such as child marriage and gender-based violence, and empower women and girls to claim their rights.

By engaging entire communities including women, men, youth, and children, the project amplified voices that were often silenced and created spaces for dialogue, reflection, and action.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Community Mass Awareness Programs:** Conducted outreach in 12 villages, reaching 340 beneficiaries, with interactive sessions on child marriage through flipcharts, storytelling, and discussions.
- International Pushkar Fair Campaign:** Engaged 512 domestic and international participants through road shows, signature campaigns, selfie corners, group discussions, and visual storytelling, spreading global awareness about women's rights.



- "My Childhood My Right" Campaign (Aug 2024):** Organized in 45 schools and villages, engaging 2,293 students in poster-making, rallies, debates, and creative activities, encouraging young voices to stand against child marriage.



Impact:

The Her Voice Project made a powerful and lasting impact across Ajmer's rural, slum, and school communities. More than 4,500 people were directly reached, including women, girls, men, and youth.

The campaigns fostered awareness about child marriage, gender justice, and legal rights while encouraging community dialogue and collective responsibility. Women and girls reported feeling more confident and informed about their rights, mothers pledged to support their daughters' education, and men expressed willingness to adopt respectful, supportive roles in families.



By engaging schools, villages, slum communities, and global audiences at the Pushkar Fair, the project not only educated but also inspired long-term social change, strengthening the fight to end violence against women.

Empowering women through capacity building

Under projects such as Empowering Women with Sustainable Livelihood and Swayam Shakti, RSKS focused on strengthening Self-Help Groups (SHGs), enhancing women's entrepreneurial and financial skills, building leadership capacity, and promoting sustainable livelihood practices. These programs aimed to create confident, self-reliant women capable of leading change in their families, SHGs, and communities.




Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Samooth Se Shakti: Oral Orientation Training:** Reached 122 SHG members from 12 groups across six villages. Built capacity in financial record-keeping, group coordination, and participatory decision-making.
- Together We Rise: Capacity Building Program:** Engaged 124 SHG members across eight villages. Strengthened leadership, record-keeping, communication, and group facilitation skills for stronger SHG functioning.



- Mastering Life's Skills Workshop:** Engaged 150 women and girls across 12 villages. Focused on decision-making, self-awareness, communication, and emotional resilience, leading to improved confidence and interpersonal skills.
- Skill Development Training (Animal Husbandry, Organic Farming, Vermicomposting):** Trained 127 women SHG members. Equipped participants with eco-friendly agricultural practices and sustainable livelihood opportunities.



Impact:

The project created a significant impact by strengthening the financial management and decision-making capacity of SHGs, while also encouraging women to step into entrepreneurial roles with confidence. The initiatives improved financial inclusion as participants learned about budgeting, savings, banking, and government welfare schemes.



Life skills workshops further enhanced communication, conflict resolution, and emotional resilience, helping women manage both personal and group responsibilities more effectively. Skill development programs promoted sustainable and eco-friendly livelihoods through organic farming, animal husbandry, and vermicomposting, ensuring long-term income opportunities.



Leadership-focused trainings built transparency, accountability, and stronger coordination within SHGs, while positivity and self-confidence workshops inspired women to voice their ideas and take leadership roles in their communities.

Collectively, these initiatives empowered over 1,000 rural women and girls in Ajmer district to become self-reliant, skilled, and confident change-makers, fostering stronger and more sustainable community development.



EDUCATION

Ensuring Education for Rural Girls

Families struggling to pay school fees or purchase essential study materials often forced their daughters to compromise on education. To address this challenge, RSKS India launched the program "Distribution of Educational Materials and School Fee Assistance for Needy School and College Girls."

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Conducted a baseline survey to identify deserving beneficiaries.
- Provided financial assistance to cover school fees for two underprivileged girls.
- Distributed essential study materials, including textbooks and stationery.

Impact:

The initiative created a life-changing impact for **two bright rural schoolgirls**, enabling them to pursue their education without the burden of financial stress. With timely fee assistance and essential study materials, the girls continued their studies smoothly and were able to appear for their board exams with confidence. This support not only secured their academic progression but also reinforced their motivation to achieve their goals and contribute positively to society.



The heartfelt gratitude expressed by the girls and their families reflects the profound difference made by this intervention. By ensuring uninterrupted education, RSKS India strengthened the belief that empowering girls through education is a powerful step toward long-term social change.



Spreading Warmth, Supporting Education

RSKS India launched the Winter Uniform and Essentials Program to help underprivileged schoolgirls. The initiative provided warmth and dignity, ensuring they could attend school regularly despite the harsh winter.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Identified and selected **301 needy and deserving schoolgirls** through a transparent process.
- Distributed winter uniforms, woollen sweaters/cardigans, shoes, socks, gloves, and woollen caps/scarves.
- Reached out across **12 villages and locations**, ensuring wide coverage and maximum benefit.
- Enabled regular school attendance by removing winter-related barriers.
- Brought joy and relief to girls and their families, many of whom expressed that the support was beyond their reach otherwise.

Impact:

The program brought warmth, comfort, and renewed confidence to **301 underprivileged schoolgirls**, empowering them to attend school regularly despite the cold season. With essential winter supplies, the girls could focus on their education without the hardship of inadequate clothing. The initiative also relieved families of the financial burden of purchasing winter essentials, reinforcing their trust in education as a pathway to a better future.



Parents expressed deep gratitude, noting that their daughters now attend school with dignity, safety, and enthusiasm. This thoughtful intervention not only supported the academic journey of these girls but also strengthened their belief in the value of education as a tool for empowerment and social upliftment.

Breaking Barriers Through Sports

In many rural areas, girls face systemic barriers that limit their participation in sports. Gender stereotypes, cultural restrictions, and lack of resources often discourage them from showcasing their talents or building confidence through physical activities.

To address this issue, RSKS India launched the **School (Sports) Dress & Sports Tennis Distribution to Needy School Girls Program** with the aim of promoting gender equality, breaking stereotypes, and empowering young girls through sports.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Identification & Selection:** 376 needy and deserving schoolgirls were identified across 16 villages through a transparent process, ensuring support reached the most deserving.
- Provided winter essentials—** uniforms, jackets, shoes, socks, gloves, and caps—enabling girls to attend school comfortably.



Impact:

The initiatives reached **376 underprivileged schoolgirls**, providing them with essential winter clothing, educational materials, hygiene kits, and access to learning support. These efforts enabled the girls to attend school regularly with warmth, dignity, and renewed confidence, effectively reducing absenteeism caused by harsh winter conditions or lack of basic resources. The programs also enhanced their self-esteem, health, and sense of belonging, allowing them to participate actively in academic and extracurricular activities without barriers.

Beyond supporting the girls directly, the initiatives eased the financial burden on families, many of whom could not afford these essentials, and reinforced their trust in education as a pathway to empowerment and social upliftment.



By ensuring that these children could continue their schooling comfortably and safely, the programs highlighted the principle that education is a right for all, regardless of socio-economic background. The interventions not only met immediate material needs but also fostered hope, motivation, and a sense of value among the girls, leaving a lasting impact on their academic journey and personal development.

Education for Every Girl

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Education Support** - Distribution of educational materials to school-going children. Awareness sessions on the importance of schooling.
- Health, Hygiene & WASH** - Awareness sessions on menstrual health and personal hygiene. Distribution of hygiene kits and installation of sanitary facilities.
- Gender Equality & SRH Awareness** - Interactive workshops on gender equality and girls' rights. Sessions on sexual and reproductive health (SRH) for adolescents.

Impact:

- The project reached **9,442 beneficiaries**, ensuring that more children could attend school regularly and fewer dropped out, resulting in stronger learning outcomes.
- Over thousands of adolescent girls improved their menstrual hygiene management, which led to a significant reduction in school absenteeism.
- Families in the community adopted healthier hygiene practices, creating a cleaner and safer environment for children.
- Hundreds of girls gained confidence, built decision-making skills, and developed greater awareness of their rights and reproductive health.



SUSTAINABLE LIVELIHOOD

At RSKS India, we recognize that economic empowerment drives lasting social change. By equipping women and girls with the skills and knowledge to make informed decisions about their health, well-being, and households, we help dismantle barriers and promote equality. This year, our Sustainable Livelihood Initiative focused on skill-based training for marginalized women and girls, empowering them to gain financial independence, boost self-confidence, and lead dignified, purposeful lives.

Beauty Parlor Training Program

RSKS India recognized the need to create sustainable livelihood opportunities for rural women and girls, particularly in areas where employment options are limited.

To address this, RSKS India organized multiple three-month Beauty Parlour Training Programs in villages such as Boraj and Choti Nagfani.

These programs aimed to equip women with professional beauty care skills while also fostering confidence, entrepreneurship, and community engagement.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Conducted a **baseline survey** to identify motivated participants: **17 women and girls in Boraj, and 22 women and girls in Choti Nagfani** for each batch.
- Offered professional training in hair care, nail art, skincare, and bridal makeup.
- Included **Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP)** sessions to enhance employability and small business knowledge.



- Integrated **Life Skills Training** and exposure to **Job Fairs** to prepare participants for real-world opportunities.
- Organized confidence-building and community events like fashion shows, sports, bridal competitions, and PTMs.
- Concluded each program with a **Certificate Distribution Ceremony** to recognize achievements.



Impact:

The Beauty Parlour Training Programs have transformed the lives of over **83 rural women and girls across Boraj and Choti Nagfani**. Participants gained practical vocational skills that enabled them to start earning from home, contributing to their household income and achieving financial independence. Beyond technical knowledge, the programs enhanced participants' self-confidence, decision-making, and leadership abilities.

Many women have become role models in their communities, inspiring others to pursue vocational training and challenge traditional gender norms. Families of the participants expressed heartfelt gratitude, highlighting the programs' role in promoting empowerment, self-reliance, and sustainable livelihoods.

Advanced Garment Making Training Program

The Covid-19 lockdown caused widespread job losses, with rural areas being disproportionately affected. Rural women, in particular, faced limited employment opportunities and lacked skills for self-employment. To address this, RSKS India organized a three-month Advanced Garment Making Training Program in Khapri. The initiative aimed to equip rural women and girls with sewing and garment-making skills, empowering them to achieve financial independence and sustainable livelihoods.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Conducted a **baseline survey** to identify motivated participants: **20 women in Batch I and 17 women in Batch II**.



- Delivered theoretical and practical training in **garment making**, including sewing techniques and clothing production.
- Incorporated **Life Skills Training** and **Entrepreneurship Development Program (EDP)** sessions to enhance confidence, decision-making, and business acumen.
- Organized **Job Fairs, Parent-Teacher Meetings, and sports competitions** to foster holistic development and community engagement.
- Shared **success stories of women entrepreneurs** to inspire participants and encourage self-employment.
- Enabled participants to practice skills at home, creating a pathway to independent income generation.

Impact:

The Advanced Garment Making Training Programs have significantly transformed the lives of **37 rural women and girls across both batches**. Participants gained practical skills that allowed them to start working from home, contributing to household income and fostering economic independence. Exposure to EDP sessions and job fairs strengthened their understanding of marketing, business planning, and entrepreneurship.



Trainees demonstrated increased confidence, improved decision-making, and a clear desire for self-employment. Families and community members acknowledged the positive change, and participants expressed heartfelt gratitude to RSKS India for providing them with the tools, skills, and motivation to build a better future. The initiative serves as a strong model of rural women's empowerment through skill development and sustainable livelihoods.



DISABILITY

Inclusive Celebration of International Day of Persons with Disabilities

Individuals with disabilities frequently encounter multiple barriers in accessing vital resources such as healthcare, education, and employment, often leading to cycles of dependency and poverty. Recognizing these challenges, RSKS India is dedicated to empowering persons with disabilities (PwDs) through comprehensive programs that promote empowerment, education, livelihood opportunities, and social and health inclusion. These initiatives strive to dismantle obstacles and foster a more equitable and inclusive society.

RSKS India under the Empowering Disability Rights Program (2024-2025), organized impactful celebrations of the International Day of Persons with Disabilities (IDPD) across rural and marginalized communities of Ajmer district.

The initiatives sought to raise awareness, promote inclusivity, and recognize the rights and contributions of persons with disabilities (PwDs).

In total, the programs engaged **478 participants from 16 villages**, including PwDs, children with disabilities (CwDs), and their families.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Awareness sessions explaining the significance of IDPD and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPWD) Act through storytelling, interactive discussions, posters, and flipcharts.
- Cake-cutting ceremonies as a symbol of unity, dignity, and collective commitment to inclusivity.



- Cultural performances such as traditional songs and dances by PwDs, showcasing their creativity and talents.
- Adapted sports and games enabling PwDs to participate actively, break stereotypes, and build confidence.
- Distribution of snacks and gifts to participants as tokens of appreciation, encouraging future involvement in community activities.



Impact:

The celebrations left a deep and lasting mark on the communities. They not only spread awareness about the rights of PwDs but also gave participants the opportunity to display their skills and feel valued. Families and community leaders expressed gratitude for the initiative and pledged to continue commemorating IDPD in the future.



The involvement of **478** individuals fostered a stronger sense of unity, dignity, and empowerment, inspiring communities to advocate for equality and inclusion while amplifying the leadership and voices of persons with disabilities.





ENVIRONMENT & SANITATION

The environment sustains all life, yet it faces growing threats from human activity. In response, RSKS India has implemented significant initiatives in environmental conservation and sanitation over the past year. These efforts aim to encourage communities to live sustainably, protect natural resources, and ensure a healthier planet for the future.

Adopt a Tree: Protect Environment & Earth

During the COVID-19 lockdown, while human activity slowed, opportunities for active environmental restoration were limited. Recognizing the urgent need to preserve and enhance the natural ecosystem, RSKS India, launched a Tree Plantation Program aimed at increasing green cover, promoting biodiversity, and fostering ecological awareness among communities, especially youth.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Planted 53 diverse trees, including fruit-bearing and shade-providing species, in collaboration with local schools.
- Coordinated with school officials to identify suitable planting sites and ensure long-term maintenance of the saplings.
- Conducted environmental conservation workshops for students and staff to raise awareness about the importance of trees, sustainable practices, and ecological balance.
- Encouraged active participation and engagement of the youth in community-driven environmental preservation.
- Outcome: Increased local green cover, improved understanding of ecological responsibility, and community commitment to sustainable practices.




Impact:

The Tree Plantation Program successfully engaged students, school staff, and RSKS team members in planting 53 trees, fostering a collective commitment to environmental conservation. The initiative educated future generations about the importance of sustainability, instilled a sense of responsibility, and encouraged continuous efforts toward ecological restoration. Local villagers and officials appreciated the program for its educational and environmental significance. Participants expressed deep gratitude to RSKS India for empowering them to take meaningful action toward preserving their natural surroundings.

Every House Tree Planting Campaign

To cultivate environmental consciousness among young learners, Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan (RSKS India) organized a large-scale Green Tree Plantation and Mass Awareness Program. Targeting rural school students, the initiative aimed to educate children on tree conservation, climate change, and sustainable practices while empowering them to take practical action for environmental preservation.



Key Activities & Outcomes:


- Engaged 605 students from multiple rural schools through interactive sessions on environmental conservation.
- Used flip charts, a life-sized Snake & Ladder game, rallies, and oath ceremonies to make learning engaging and memorable.



- Distributed Green Tree Saplings, Seed Pens, Notebooks, and Chocolates to each student, encouraging hands-on participation in tree planting and environmental care.
- Outcome: Created a culture of eco-responsibility among students, linking theoretical learning with actionable practices and fostering long-term environmental stewardship.

Impact:

The program successfully empowered 605 students to understand, value, and actively participate in environmental protection. By planting trees, taking climate pledges, and sharing knowledge within their families and communities, students became catalysts for grassroots ecological change. The combination of education, practical tools, and interactive learning inspired sustainable behaviors and strengthened community awareness of climate action.



Plant Grafted Fruit Trees For Marginalized Families

RSKS India initiated a Tree Plantation Program aimed at enhancing green cover, fostering ecological awareness, and instilling environmental responsibility among school children and communities.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Planted 427 diverse trees, including fruit-bearing and shade-providing species, across multiple schools.
- Collaborated with school officials to ensure proper planting and long-term care of the saplings.
- Engaged 61 school children in environmental awareness sessions, teaching the importance of sustainability and conservation.

This initiative demonstrates the transformative power of youth-driven environmental programs and reinforces the importance of investing in green education for long-term ecological impact.

Outcome: Participants developed a sense of responsibility toward nature and committed to continuing tree planting activities in the future.



Impact:

The Tree Plantation Program successfully engaged 105 beneficiaries—including 45 students, 30 school staff, and 30 community members—in hands-on environmental action. The 427 trees planted will provide long-term benefits, such as improved air quality, enhanced biodiversity, and habitats for local wildlife. By pledging to continue these efforts annually, participants demonstrated a commitment to collective environmental stewardship. The initiative received appreciation from local officials and villagers for promoting sustainability and educating future generations on ecological responsibility.

Save The Innocent Sparrow Birds Program

The steady decline in house sparrow populations has become an alarming ecological issue, as these small birds once thrived in close association with human settlements. Factors such as rapid urbanization, loss of nesting spaces, excessive use of chemical pesticides, and changes in lifestyle patterns have contributed significantly to their disappearance.

Recognizing that sparrows are not only indicators of environmental health but also vital for maintaining ecological balance, efforts have been initiated to restore their habitats and create awareness among communities about the importance of coexisting with urban wildlife.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Installed 210 eco-friendly birdhouses and sparrow feeders in urban and rural areas to provide secure nesting sites and food sources.
- Conducted awareness campaigns to educate the community on the ecological significance of sparrows and the need for their protection.



Impact:

The program has successfully revived local sparrow populations, with birds actively nesting in the installed birdhouses and feeders. Residents now experience the cheerful presence of sparrows, enhancing both the ecological and aesthetic environment of their communities.



By engaging individuals in conservation practices, the initiative has strengthened community awareness and involvement in protecting biodiversity. This project also contributes to long-term ecological balance, serving as a model for similar wildlife conservation efforts across India. RSKS India expresses sincere gratitude to all participants and supporters, whose collective action ensures that future generations can enjoy the presence of house sparrows in their surroundings.



Total Clean India Campaign

Promoting cleanliness, hygiene, and environmental responsibility among youth is crucial for creating sustainable and healthy communities. RSKS India implemented the School Clean and Mass Awareness Campaign across 12 rural schools to engage students in understanding the importance of personal hygiene, school cleanliness, and environmental stewardship.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Reached 604 school students with interactive and practical learning experiences.
- Utilized engaging tools such as flip charts, a life-sized Snake & Ladder game, cleanliness demonstrations, public rallies, and oath ceremonies to make the learning process fun and impactful.
- Distributed Seed Pens, Notebooks, Chocolates, Brooms, and Green Tree Saplings to students, enabling them to take practical action at school and home.

- Outcome: Students became ambassadors of cleanliness, equipped with knowledge, practical tools, and motivation to maintain hygiene and contribute to environmental care.



This initiative empowered the youth to champion a cleaner, greener, and healthier future for their communities, demonstrating the power of education and active participation in environmental conservation.

Impact:

The campaign created a transformative effect on students, teachers, and local families. Through hands-on learning and participatory activities, children developed strong habits of personal hygiene and school cleanliness, fostering a sense of responsibility toward the environment. The gifts distributed such as brooms, saplings, and educational tools reinforced the campaign's message, ensuring long-term engagement and creating a ripple effect of positive behavioral change.

Tree Plantation & Mass Awareness Kheda Karm Sotan & Rampura Ahiran



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Planted 53 diverse trees, including fruit-bearing and shade-providing species, across various schools.
- Collaborated closely with school officials to identify suitable planting sites and ensure the ongoing care of the saplings.
- Engaged 57 school children in environmental conservation awareness activities to educate and empower the younger generation.
- Participants actively engaged in greening their schools and communities, while also gaining awareness of ecological stewardship and the lasting benefits of tree planting



Impact:

The program fostered a culture of environmental responsibility as school children, staff, and community members planted and cared for 53 trees. Participants pledged to continue annual plantation, reinforcing collective action for ecological preservation. Village officials praised the initiative for raising environmental awareness among future generations. The trees will enhance biodiversity, improve air quality, and support ecological balance, while the program's success highlighted the strong commitment of RSKS India to building sustainable communities.



AGRICULTURE & LIVESTOCK

Covid-19 Relief and Awareness: Empowering Girls Through Education

RSKS India continued to strengthen rural resilience and community empowerment through a range of initiatives under the Agriculture and Livestock focus area. These programs not only addressed farming challenges but also supported children's education, health, and community well-being, recognizing that sustainable development requires a holistic approach.

As part of the Covid-19 Relief and Awareness project, RSKS India recognized that economic hardship and lack of resources often prevent girls in rural and marginalized urban areas from accessing quality education. Many face additional barriers such as household responsibilities, social neglect, and inadequate learning materials. To address these challenges, the program aimed to provide essential educational resources while raising awareness about the transformative power of education for girls.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Under the Covid-19 Relief and Awareness project, 200 primary school girls across 11 villages received school bags, water bottles, and educational materials.
- Conducted awareness sessions using storytelling and examples to highlight the value of education in empowering girls, fostering independence, and breaking poverty cycles.
- Encouraged community dialogue to prioritize girls' education and challenge social biases.



Impact:

The initiative effectively removed critical barriers that had previously hindered girls from attending school, allowing them to participate more regularly and actively in their education. Many of the beneficiaries, for the first time, experienced a newfound sense of confidence, motivation, and belonging within the classroom and their communities. Through this project, RSKS India successfully combined material support with awareness building, fostering education, empowerment, and community engagement, paving the way for a brighter and more equitable future for girls.



Empowering Farmers through Seed & Fertilizer Support

RSKS India recognizes the challenges faced by small-scale and marginalized farmers, including limited access to quality seeds, fertilizers, and essential tools, which constrain productivity and economic stability.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Implemented the Fertilizer, Seeds & Farming Material Distribution Program in five underdeveloped villages.
- Reached 50 farmers, including women and persons with disabilities.
- Distributed certified seeds, organic and chemical fertilizers, and basic farming tools.
- Conducted interactive sessions and demonstrations in local languages to ensure understanding and adoption.



Impact:

The program enhanced livelihoods, reduced dependency on loans, and fostered self-reliance among farmers. Women and marginalized participants reported increased confidence and respect in their communities. Knowledge-sharing and adoption of sustainable practices created a ripple effect, laying the foundation for long-term agricultural productivity, rural resilience, and community empowerment.

Holi Mahotsav 2025: Colors of Inclusion

RSKS India recognizes that economic hardship often prevents marginalized families, particularly small scale farmers and slum dwellers, from participating in festivals. To address this, the organization initiated a Holi celebration that focused on inclusion, joy, and community bonding.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Implemented the Holi Mahotsav 2025: Sweets Packets Distribution Program across 4 villages.
- Benefited **120 marginalized farmer and slum-dwelling families**.
- Distributed sweets to families, fostering a festive and inclusive environment.
- Outcome: Families felt seen, valued, and included; children experienced excitement and joy, reinforcing social cohesion and unity.



Impact:

The program brought emotional upliftment and happiness to underserved communities, fostering dignity, togetherness, and social harmony. Families expressed heartfelt appreciation, while children's excitement spread joy throughout the villages. This initiative reinforced the importance of celebrating festivals inclusively, helping build a compassionate and connected community.

Foundations for Early Learning

RSKS India recognizes that young children in rural, underprivileged communities often miss out on early education due to poverty and lack of resources. To ensure consistent participation and cognitive development, the organization implemented a program providing essential learning materials and school uniforms.



- Held awareness sessions for parents and caregivers, emphasizing the importance of early education.
- Outcome: Children were equipped for school, motivated to attend, and families gained understanding of early learning benefits.

Impact:

The program enhanced school readiness and enthusiasm among **100 children**, while empowering families with knowledge about the value of early education. Parents reported reduced financial burden and increased motivation to prioritize learning. The initiative fostered a positive ripple effect, inspiring communities to invest in the potential of their youngest learners and build a stronger educational foundation.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Conducted the Uniform & Educational Stuff Distribution Program across **6 villages**.
- Reached **100 needy Anganwadi children**.
- Distributed school uniforms and basic educational materials.



CHILD RIGHT & WELFARE


Countless children from slum and street communities are denied the simple joys of childhood due to poverty and hardship. To bring light into their lives, RSKS India initiated the Make a Wish for Street and Slum Children project, an ongoing program focused on spreading happiness and supporting the overall development of these children. Through diverse and meaningful activities, the initiative seeks to nurture young minds, uplift spirits, and create opportunities for a brighter future.

Mass Awareness Program on Ending Child Marriage

Children in slum and street communities often face heightened vulnerability to child marriage, abuse, and exploitation due to poverty, lack of education, and limited awareness of their rights. RSKS India implemented two key initiatives, Mass Awareness Program on Ending Child Marriage and हमारा अधिकार अभियान (Make A Wish for Street & Slum Children), to educate children and communities about their rights, promote personal safety, and prevent early marriage. These programs empower children, especially girls, by fostering legal literacy, confidence, and a supportive community environment.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Conducted the Mass Awareness Program on Ending Child Marriage across 12 slum and street locations, engaging 300 children and families. The sessions raised awareness about the harmful impact of child marriage on health, education, and well-being while highlighting the legal age of marriage and child protection laws
- Rolled out "हमारा अधिकार अभियान" workshops from December 20-26, 2024, across 12 locations, reaching 300 street and slum children, with a focus on creating legal literacy and awareness on ending violence against children and girls.



- Used interactive and child-friendly strategies, including flipcharts, storytelling, group discussions, role plays, and the "My Selfie" activity, to engage participants effectively.
- Outcomes: Children and families gained knowledge about their rights, legal protections, personal safety, and strategies to prevent early marriage and abuse.



Impact:

Both programs empowered **300 children and their communities** to recognize and resist child marriage and violence. Girls reported increased confidence and awareness about self-protection, while boys pledged to support a respectful, violence-free environment. Community members observed the initiatives, fostering a broader culture of responsibility and child protection. These efforts strengthened the community's capacity to safeguard children's rights, nurture informed and confident youth, and promote long-term social change.

Festival Celebration Programs

Many children from underprivileged communities, including those living in slums or on the streets, are deprived of the joy, cultural experiences, and innocence of a traditional childhood. Recognizing this, RSKS India launched the "**Make a Wish for Street & Slum Children**" initiative.

This year-round program aims to spread happiness, inclusion, and cultural learning among marginalized children, ensuring they experience festive joy and a sense of belonging.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Christmas Celebration (25th Dec 2024):** 140 children across **4 locations** enjoyed gifts, soft toys, festive music, and interactive activities, fostering joy and inclusion.
- Deepawali Mahotsav (23rd-28th Oct 2024):** 550 children across **23 locations** received festival dresses, sweets, and candles, celebrating Diwali for the first time and experiencing dignity, belonging, and cultural joy.
- Dussehra Mahotsav (12th Oct 2024):** 222 children at **6 locations** participated in storytelling, Ramayana role plays, sweets distribution, and games, enhancing cultural learning and social engagement.

- Holi Mahotsav:** 500 children from **20 locations** celebrated with colors, water games, dancing, and sweets, while learning about the festival's cultural significance, promoting joy and inclusion.



Impact:

The festival programs under the "**Make a Wish for Street & Slum Children**" initiative successfully brought joy, inclusion, and cultural awareness to hundreds of marginalized children. Through hands-on participation, gift distribution, and immersive celebrations, children experienced happiness, dignity, and a sense of belonging. Families and communities were engaged, fostering social cohesion and support.

The initiative ensured that children from underprivileged backgrounds could celebrate, learn, and feel valued, reinforcing RSKS India's commitment to spreading hope, empowerment, and festive cheer among vulnerable communities.


Empowering Street & Slum Children: Life Skills, Safety, and Education

Under the "**Make a Wish for Street & Slum Children**" initiative, RSKS India implemented a series of programs to empower vulnerable children across Ajmer district. The focus was on holistic development, including discipline, moral values, personal safety, life skills, education awareness, and cultural inclusion.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Discipline & Moral Values Camps**
 - Interactive sessions using life-size Snakes & Ladders, games, and storytelling taught children discipline, ethics, nutrition, and traditional values.
- SPARSH - Good Touch/Bad Touch Awareness** - Children learned about personal safety, boundaries, and self-protection through engaging discussions, visuals, and activity-based learning.
- SHIKSHA - Education Awareness**
 - Fun, interactive sessions emphasized the importance of primary education, literacy, and numeracy, motivating children to pursue learning.



Impact:

The festival programs under the "Make a Wish for Street & Slum Children" initiative successfully brought joy, inclusion, and cultural awareness to hundreds of marginalized children. Through hands-on participation, gift distribution, and immersive celebrations, children experienced happiness, dignity, and a sense of belonging. Families and communities were engaged, fostering social cohesion and support. The initiative ensured that children from underprivileged backgrounds could celebrate, learn, and feel valued, reinforcing RSKS India's commitment to spreading hope, empowerment, and festive cheer among vulnerable communities.

Child Health & Hygiene Empowerment

As part of the "Make a Wish for Street & Slum Children" initiative, RSKS India implemented targeted programs to improve health, hygiene, and nutrition awareness among vulnerable children across Ajmer district. These programs combined practical support with interactive learning, ensuring children were protected, informed, and empowered to make healthy choices.



- Poshan Pathshala - Healthy Eating:** 550 children learned about balanced diets, with nutritious food distributed.
- Proteins & Vitamins Camps:** 791 children received lessons on nutrition, proteins, vitamins, along with protein-rich food and cooking demos.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Summer Care Program:** 501 children received slippers, food packets, and guidance on heatstroke prevention and hygiene.
- Hygiene Kit & Food Distribution:** 550 children received hygiene kits and nutrition education.



Impact:

The initiative reached and benefited more than 2,000 children by integrating education with essential health support. Through the program, children gained a stronger understanding of hygiene, nutrition, and safety practices, which contributed to noticeable improvements in their overall well-being. Parents and community members expressed deep gratitude, observing increased confidence, empowerment, and positive behavioral changes among the children. The programs also reinforced RSKS's dedication to holistic care by combining health education with sustainable approaches to child development, ensuring long-term impact on the lives of vulnerable children.



HEALTH

Be Free, Be Happy, Be Smiley

For over three decades, RSKS India has been at the forefront of addressing systemic healthcare challenges faced by marginalized and underprivileged communities. In a country where access to quality healthcare remains a privilege for a select few, our mission has been to ensure that essential health services and awareness reach those who are often overlooked. This year, we made notable strides in promoting women's health, implementing impactful initiatives such as:

Under the banner of "Be Free, Be Happy, Be Smiley", RSKS India implemented a Menstrual Health Awareness Program aimed at empowering women and adolescent girls in underserved communities.

The initiative focused on bridging gaps in knowledge about menstrual hygiene, promoting safe practices, and fostering confidence and well-being among participants.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- Conducted awareness sessions across 49 remote locations, reaching 2,508 participants.
- Used interactive educational tools such as flip charts, posters, aprons, and awareness videos to explain menstrual health concepts effectively.
- Facilitated open discussions, enabling participants to ask questions, share experiences, and clarify doubts about hygiene and related health practices.
- Distributed 7,500 sanitary napkins, ensuring access to essential hygiene products.
- Outcome: Participants gained practical knowledge about menstrual care, safe practices, and hygiene management, enhancing confidence, self-care, and overall well-being.



Impact:

The program significantly raised awareness of menstrual hygiene and empowered participants to adopt safe practices. Women and girls expressed gratitude for the support, reporting improved confidence in managing their menstrual health. Local authorities commended the initiative and encouraged organizing similar programs regularly. By combining education with the provision of sanitary products, the program ensured both immediate relief and long-term empowerment, aligning with the mission of "Be Free, Be Happy, Be Smiley" to foster health, dignity, and confidence among marginalized communities.



CAMPAIGN & ADVOCACY

Mass Awareness Program

Campaigns and advocacy serve as powerful drivers of community engagement, empowering people to take an active role in shaping a better future.

Throughout the year, RSKS India utilized these approaches to promote awareness, encourage inclusion, and create meaningful change through various festivals and social awareness programs.

Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan (RSKS India) has been dedicated to empowering marginalized communities across Rajasthan for over three decades. Beyond addressing basic needs, the organization emphasizes education, gender equality, environmental awareness, and social cohesion. In 2024-2025, RSKS India conducted a series of programs and celebrations aimed at educating, inspiring, and uplifting participants from rural, slum, and marginalized communities, ensuring that every individual, especially women, girls, and children, gains awareness of their rights, heritage, and potential.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

- RSKS India celebrated **Independence Day** across three villages, engaging **105 participants** in **flag hoisting**, motivational talks, cultural programs, and storytelling to foster patriotism and unity.
- On **Children's Day**, fifty children from **underserved communities** learned about their rights through storytelling and received chocolates.
- International Women's Day** and **International Girl Child Day** celebrations included cultural performances, interactive workshops, rallies, and games, empowering women and girls while raising community awareness about gender equality and education.



- The Life Skills Education Program engaged **645 women and girls** in **20 villages and Anganwadi centers**, building confidence, decision-making, communication, hygiene, and gender rights through interactive sessions and kits.
- On **National Pollution Control Day**, **48 children** from **slum and street areas** learned eco-friendly habits through storytelling, discussions, and activities.
- The “Positive Thinking - Better Future” program engaged **550 students** across eleven villages in workshops, games, debates, and storytelling to build self-awareness, emotional resilience, and critical thinking.
- Women’s Equality Day programs educated **50 rural participants** about gender equality and women’s rights through interactive sessions.

- RSKS India celebrated **Republic Day** with **105 beneficiaries**, including women trainees, Pathshala girls, and street children. The event featured flag hoisting, cultural performances, and motivational activities, fostering confidence, unity, and civic awareness among participants.



Through these initiatives, RSKS India educated over 1,805 participants on social, educational, environmental, and gender-related issues. Participants gained greater awareness of patriotism, children’s rights, women’s empowerment, and environmental responsibility. The programs strengthened community participation, unity, and dialogue, while providing opportunities for self-expression, cultural engagement, and recognition, particularly for women, girls, and children. These efforts created a lasting ripple effect, inspiring participants to apply their learning, advocate for rights, and contribute positively to their communities. Overall, the initiatives reinforced RSKS India’s mission to promote dignity, empowerment, and social development at the grassroots level.

Impact:





DISASTER RELIEF

RSKS India views disaster relief not only in the context of natural calamities but also in terms of economic shocks, pandemics, seasonal hardships, and social vulnerabilities that disrupt the lives of marginalized communities. In 2024-2025, the organization carried out a series of interventions to provide immediate relief and strengthen resilience among vulnerable groups.

Deepawali Mahotsav 2024

Every year, many families from nomadic, slum, and street communities are unable to celebrate festivals due to poverty and daily struggles.

To bring joy and inclusion, RSKS India, under the Humanity Relief to the Helpless in India project, organized a special Diwali celebration. The event included the distribution of sweets and lighting of lamps, giving children and families an opportunity to experience the festive spirit and feel a sense of togetherness.

Key Activities & Outcomes:

The celebration was organized across seven different slum and street locations, directly reaching **263 participants**. Sweet packets were distributed among children and families, while volunteers and staff lit candles and lamps in homes that usually remain dark during the festival. Songs, prayers, and storytelling sessions were also arranged to recreate the festive spirit. These activities not only brought joy but also allowed community members to experience togetherness and cultural inclusion.




Impact:

For many participants, this was their first opportunity to celebrate Diwali in such a meaningful way. The initiative spread happiness, strengthened community bonds, and gave families a sense of hope and belonging.



Marriage Support for Orphaned and Deprived Girls

In rural areas, orphaned and economically deprived young women face major challenges in getting married due to financial barriers and lack of family support. To uphold dignity and empowerment, RSKS India provides targeted assistance.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

Through this initiative, one orphaned and underprivileged woman received financial assistance to cover marriage expenses along with household essentials such as utensils, bedding, and other necessary items to begin her new life. The support was tailored to her immediate needs and coordinated in consultation with the family and community elders, ensuring she could celebrate her wedding with dignity.



Impact:

The support reduced her financial stress and enabled her to begin a new chapter in life with dignity and confidence. It reflects RSKS India's commitment to social justice and women's empowerment in times of personal crisis.

Ration, Grocery, and Hygiene Kit Distribution

The COVID-19 pandemic left poor, disabled, nomadic, and slum-dwelling families in extreme distress, struggling to access food and hygiene essentials. To address these urgent needs, RSKS India implemented relief measures.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

RSKS India identified 16 beneficiaries through community consultations and provided ration, grocery, and hygiene kits. Each kit included flour, pulses, rice, oil, spices, soybean, tea, bathing and washing soaps, and sanitizer. Distribution was carried out following health protocols, ensuring both safety and dignity. The beneficiaries expressed relief at receiving items that sustained them through weeks of uncertainty.



Impact:

This intervention provided immediate food security, supported hygiene, and helped beneficiaries maintain dignity during the crisis.

It reinforced RSKS India's dedication to ensuring no family is left behind in emergencies.



Exam Fee Assistance for Disadvantaged Students

In rural and economically marginalized communities, many talented students are forced to discontinue their studies due to financial hardship. A major barrier for such students is the inability to afford board examination fees, which restricts their academic progress and future opportunities. To address this, Rajasthan Samgrah Kalyan Sansthan (RSKS India) initiated the Board Exam Fee Support Program.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

Under this initiative, RSKS India provided full financial support to **16 underprivileged students of Class 10 and 12** by covering their board examination fees.

This ensured that financial difficulties did not prevent them from appearing for their exams. The program also offered encouragement and morale-boosting support to the students and their families, helping them focus on their education without worry.



Impact:

This support ensured that financial constraints did not hinder the students' education, enabling them to appear for board exams with confidence and focus. By covering their examination fees, the program not only eased the economic burden on their families but also motivated the students to pursue their studies with determination. It reinforced the principle of equal access to education, empowered underprivileged youth, and contributed to building a foundation for their future academic and career opportunities.

Warm Blanket Distribution for Winter Relief

Harsh winters are especially difficult for homeless, poor, and nomadic families lacking adequate shelter and warm clothing. Cold weather leaves them vulnerable to illness and suffering.



Key Activities & Outcomes:

RSKS India distributed 400 warm blankets across 14 locations, focusing on homeless individuals, street dwellers, and nomadic groups. Beneficiaries were identified through surveys and local leader recommendations to ensure the blankets reached the most vulnerable. The distribution was carried out directly in community spaces and temporary shelters, offering immediate protection against the cold.



Impact:

The program offered immediate warmth, comfort, and safety to **400 individuals**. Beyond physical relief, it brought hope, dignity, and emotional reassurance to communities during a season of hardship.





RSKS India at the 56rd, 57th, 58th & 59th United Nations Human Rights Council Sessions

RSKS India actively participated in the 56th, 57th, 58th, and 59th sessions of the United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC) and hosted multiple side events at the United Nations Office in Geneva, Switzerland. Across these sessions, the organization showcased its commitment to gender equality, diversity, and inclusive development. The themes of its engagements were: 56th Session – Harmony in Diversity, 57th Session – Exposing Injustices and Advancing Rights, 58th Session – Equality, Rights, and Inclusion, and 59th Session – Solidarity and Accountability.

56th Session - Harmony in Diversity

This session emphasized minority empowerment, human rights in Pakistan-occupied territories, women's safety, education rights, and India's climate initiatives. Contributions featured:

- Five oral interventions delivered.
- Fifteen oral interventions submitted.
- Five written statements highlighting India's global solidarity and sustainable development.

57th Session - Exposing Injustices and Advancing Rights

The session underscored India's Citizenship Amendment Act, plight of minorities in Pakistan, human rights in POGB and POJK, and grassroots empowerment by RSKS. Contributions featured:

The discussions centered on internal displacement in Pakistan, religious persecution, combating terrorism, and India's empowerment programs for women and persons with disabilities. Contributions featured:


- Seven oral interventions delivered.
