MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

AMBASSADORS IN SPORT – HOPE ACADEMY

And

COLLEGE OF CAPE TOWN

OCTOBER 2010

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING is concluded on this.....day of2010.

BETWEEN:

- 1. **AMBASSADORS IN SPORT – HOPE ACADEMY**, a part of AIS International, established as a Christian non-profit organisation, located at Adam House, Orion Road, Lansdowne, 7800.
- 2. **COLLEGE OF CAPE TOWN**, a Further Education and Training College established under the FET Act 98 of 1998 (hereinafter referred to as **College of Cape Town**) located at 334 Albert Road, Salt River, Cape Town.

BACKGROUND

A. This Memorandum of Understanding demonstrates an intention by College of Cape Town and Ambassadors in Sport – Hope Academy to work together to establish an affiliation in order to develop skills and career paths which will benefit the youth affiliated with The Hope Academy and ultimately lead to these youths obtaining full qualifications.

1. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS

1.1 In this Memorandum of Understanding including the Recitals, the following definitions apply, unless the context otherwise requires:

“MoU” means this Memorandum of Understanding and includes all Schedules, Annexure and any amendments pursuant to this MoU of which it is not the intent to be legally enforceable.

“Party” or “Parties” means a party or parties to this MoU.

1.2 In this MoU unless the contrary intention appears,

- (a) References to this MoU or any other instrument including this MoU or any other instrument as varied or replaced and notwithstanding any change in the identity of the Parties;

- (b) Headings have been inserted for convenience only and shall not be taken into account in interpreting the MoU;
- (c) words denoting any gender include every other gender; and
- (d) Words importing the singular number will include the plural number and vice versa.

2 SCOPE OF THIS MEMORANDUM

The Parties intend to:

- a) Work together to establish an affiliation in order to develop skills and career paths which will benefit the youth affiliated with The Hope Academy and ultimately lead to these youths obtaining full qualifications;
- b) Provide opportunities for said youth to become self-sustainable and make a positive contribution to their communities and the South African economy at large.
- c) Encourage staff and youth interaction and create opportunities for best practice exchange;
- d) Act in good spirit of co-operation in their dealing with each other;
- e) The signatories are designated to co-ordinate the implementation of this agreement.

3 REVIEW OF THIS MEMORANDUM

College of Cape Town and Ambassadors in Sport – Hope Academy intend to:

- (a) Oversee the progress of this MoU and enter into dialogue when relevant; and
- (b) Maintain regular contact with the view to regular reviews as to its effectiveness and relevance to both parties;

4 PURPOSE OF THIS MEMORANDUM

- (a) The provisions of this MoU are intended to describe the manner and extent to which the Parties will work together;
- (b) This MoU is to provide the framework in which the Parties will establish an effective working relationship in order to promote College of Cape Town and Ambassadors in Sport – Hope Academy;
- (c) This MoU records the current level of understanding between the Parties and is a record of their intentions in respect of the issues described in this MoU.
- (d) The Parties agree that this MoU is not contractually binding and that this MoU does not impose any legal liability or obligation on the State, any Minister of the Government of the State, the Parties or their respective employees and advisers.

Executed as a Memorandum of Understanding.





