Delivered over 2500 appointments in London, Edinburgh, Manchester and Reading

59% of those we were able to contact went on to succeed at interview

Smart Works is now helping women in Manchester, Edinburgh and Reading, as well as North and West London.

Each centre will aim to **increase the number of women** we help this year, whilst maintaining our success rate at one in two getting the job.

Smart Works **Birmingham** will open its doors to clients in July 2016.

We want to see Smart Works in a maximum of **two new cities** every year. We will help more women with an ambitious but sustainable plan for growth. Our mission is to help women back into the workplace by giving them the clothes and the confidence they need to succeed at interview.

Our vision is to build London as our centre of excellence and share this expertise by taking Smart Works to other cities across the UK.

To deliver a service that works

At the heart of Smart Works sits a two hours dressing and coaching service for unemployed women with a confirmed job interview.

Each client received a complete outfit of clothes and accessories (theirs to keep) and interview training, enabling them to not only feel more confident, but to start to believe in their own ability to succeed.

We have a team of over 150 volunteers across the UK who work with our clients – skilled, compassionate and brilliant women who give their time to help other women succeed.

All our clothing is donated from other women or direct from retailers, incredibly high quality clothing, meticulously sorted and hung in our beautiful dressing rooms.

This simple model works. A visit to Smart Works can change the course of a women's life.
