our response

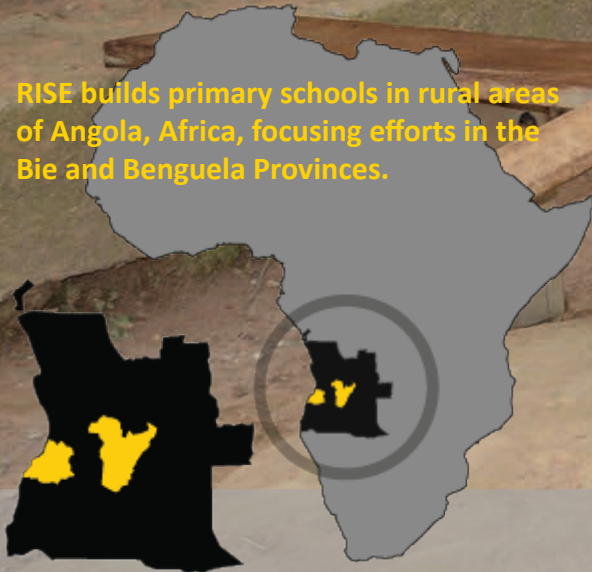
RISE builds primary schools in rural Angola to educate children, empower communities and contribute to the rebuilding of the country.

RISE builds primary schools in rural areas
of Angola, Africa, focusing efforts in the
Bie and Benguela Provinces.



Since 2003, RISE has built 158 schools in Angola,
bringing the opportunity for education to over 103,000 children.

Two schools were completed and dedicated in 2015...

Sibol - 3 additional classrooms funded by Team RISE 2014 and Baker Hughes
Quipungo - 6 classrooms funded by BP Angola and Partners



Four schools were funded and construction began...

Trumba - full funding for 8 classrooms was reached in May 2015

Alto Esperanca - 8 classrooms, located in a dry, desert-like area, means “high hope”



In partnership with BP Angola and Partners...

Cicolo - 16 classrooms, 2 labs, offices, bathrooms, cafeteria and basketball court

Tomas Ferreira - 12 rehabbed and 12 new classrooms, offices, bathrooms and basketball court



A broader impact...

school feeding programs, jobs and stimulus to the local economy, distribution of another 5,630 TOMS shoes, wells drilled at 3 additional school sites



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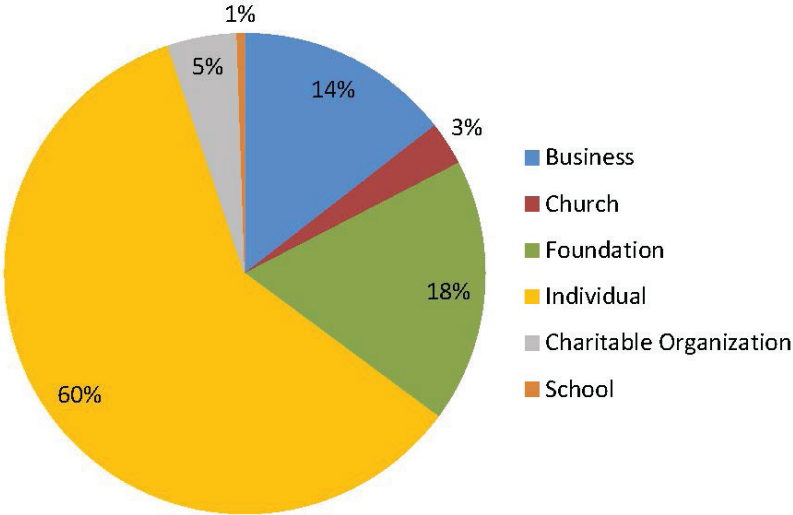

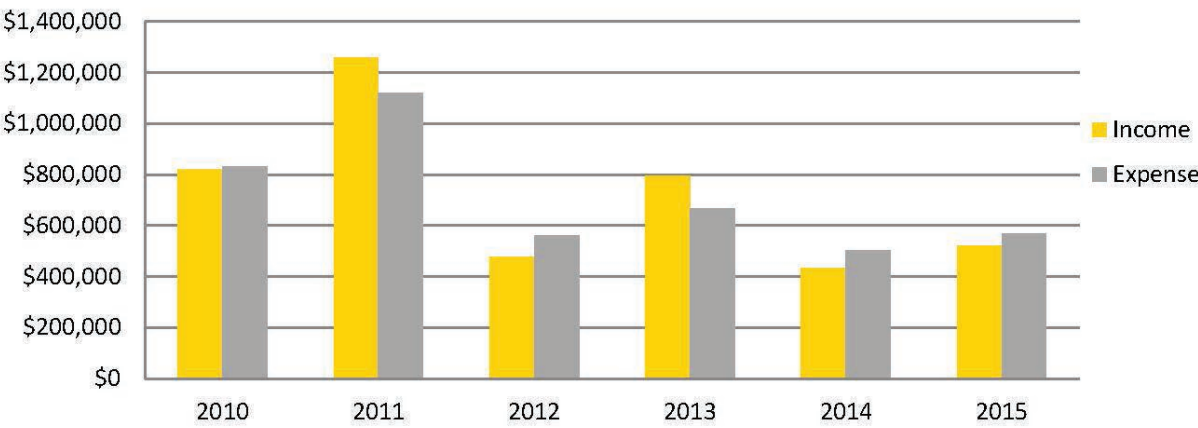


Source and use of funds

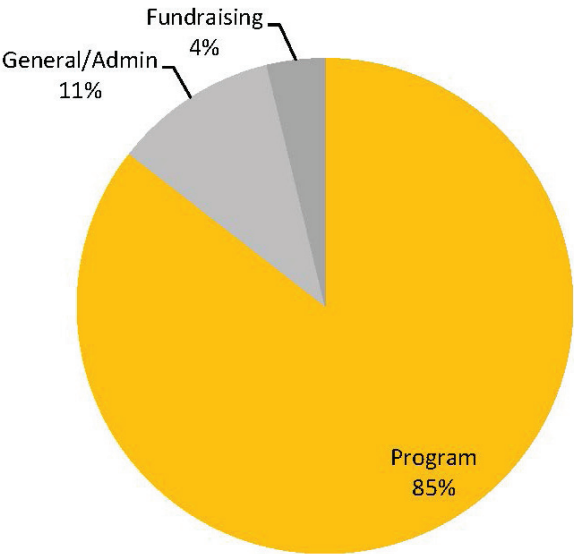
2015 - Source of Income



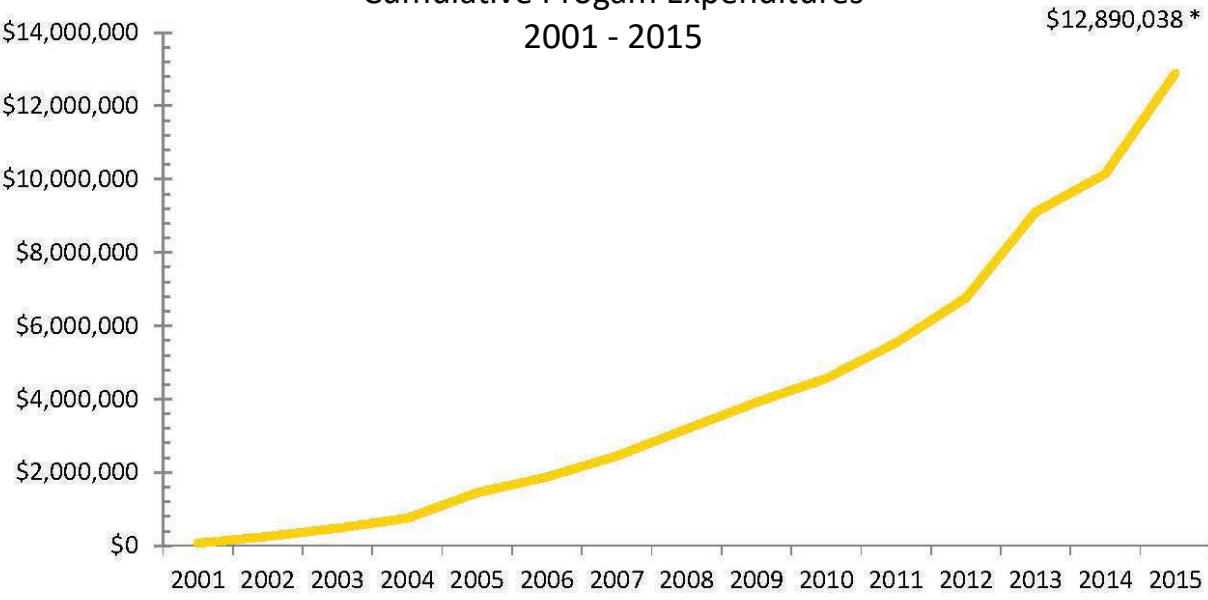
Income and Expense Comparison
