

Increasing the economic value of forests and brushwood

Recovering degraded areas



Since 1995 we have planted more than 80,000 trees, including rainforest rare wood trees. The aim is to get close to the original mix.

We increase the density of palm trees, fruit trees and others of commercial value, to help promote sustainable exploitation of the forest and of recuperated degraded areas.

Reforestation from local seeds Seed bank of rainforest species



Salveaserra maintains a simple seed bank of local forest species to ensure that reforestation respects existing (original) genetic profile.

We make seeds and seedlings available for our plantations and also advise small farmers of reforestation procedures.


Relevance for a huge, severely degraded region
