
# JOIN THE MOVEMENT TO END RELATIONSHIP ABUSE



### WHY ONE LOVE



- Yeardley Love was a senior at the University of Virginia when she was beaten to death by her ex-boyfriend.
- While many knew of "drama" in their relationship, no one in Yeardley's life had any idea that she was at real risk.
- After her death, Yeardley's family learned that relationship violence is an unspoken epidemic in the U.S.
- Women ages 16-24 are at 3X greater risk of being in an abusive relationship than any other demographic
