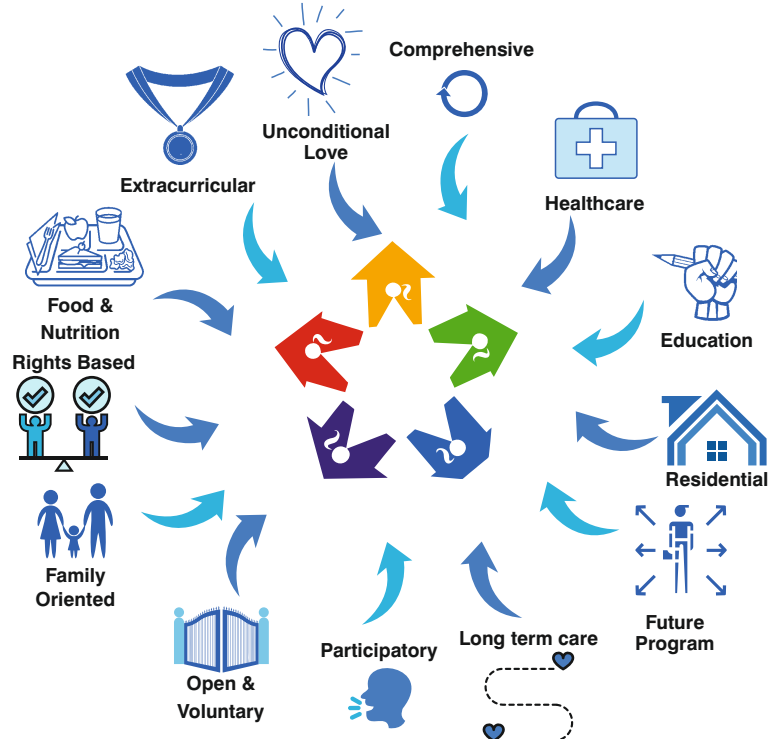

- Children are not locked up inside a home

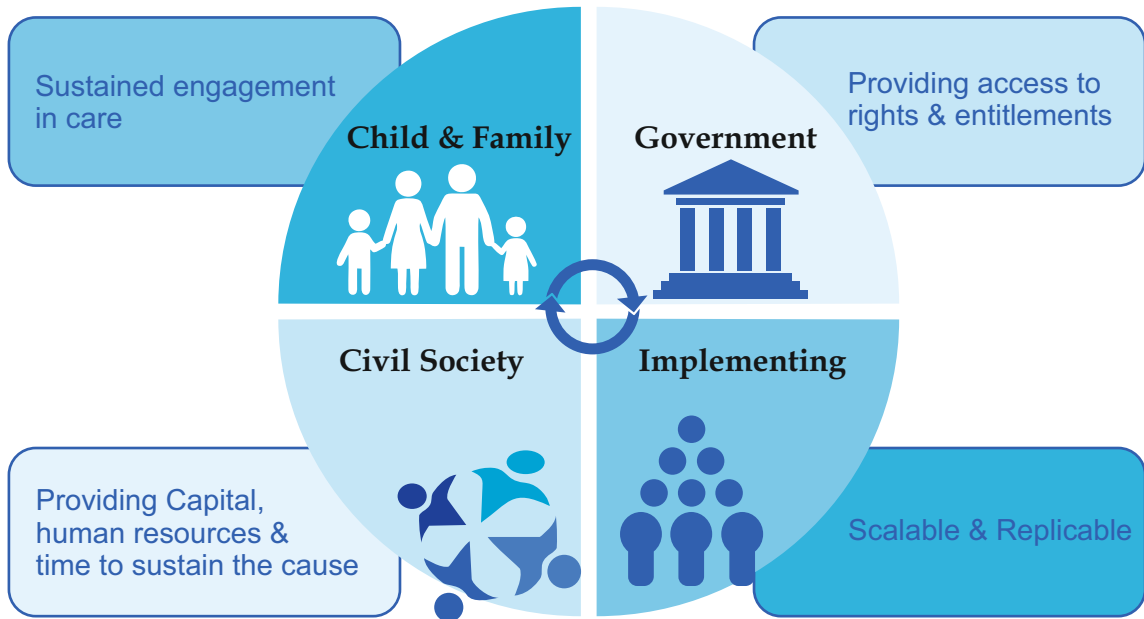
CHILD-CENTRIC APPROACH

- Child has stake in her development through participation via **Bal Sabha** and **child committees**

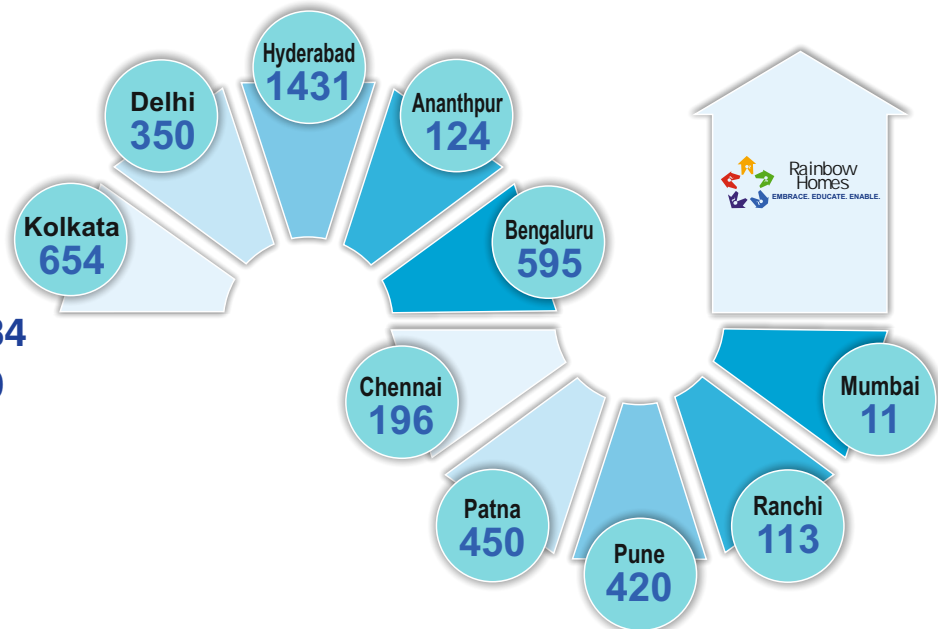
ACCOUNTABLE & TRANSPARENT
