Hong Kong Cancer Fund Annual Review 2017-2018

We are deeply grateful for your loyal support as we continue to expand our services in the community. This was our 30th year and we have reached new major milestones in our mission to provide seamless cancer supportive care.

We launched the new Cancer Fund Jockey Club Support Centre in Kwai Chung to reach even more people in Kowloon and New Territories West in June 2017, and re-opened our Cancer Fund Support Centre in Central. In the last year, we had more than 112,000 visits at our five support centres.

We were happy to serve 4,086 new clients and offer them a new approach of an array of multi-disciplinary services through our specialists such as Clinical Psychologists, Dietitians and Art Therapists. Our Wellness programmes keep growing with the addition of videos on our YouTube channel and more than 51,000 people attended our classes.

As we look toward the new year, we are excited about our new Women's cancer centre, the first free care centre in Hong Kong that offers services for the needs of women who are experiencing breast and gynaecological cancers and their families.

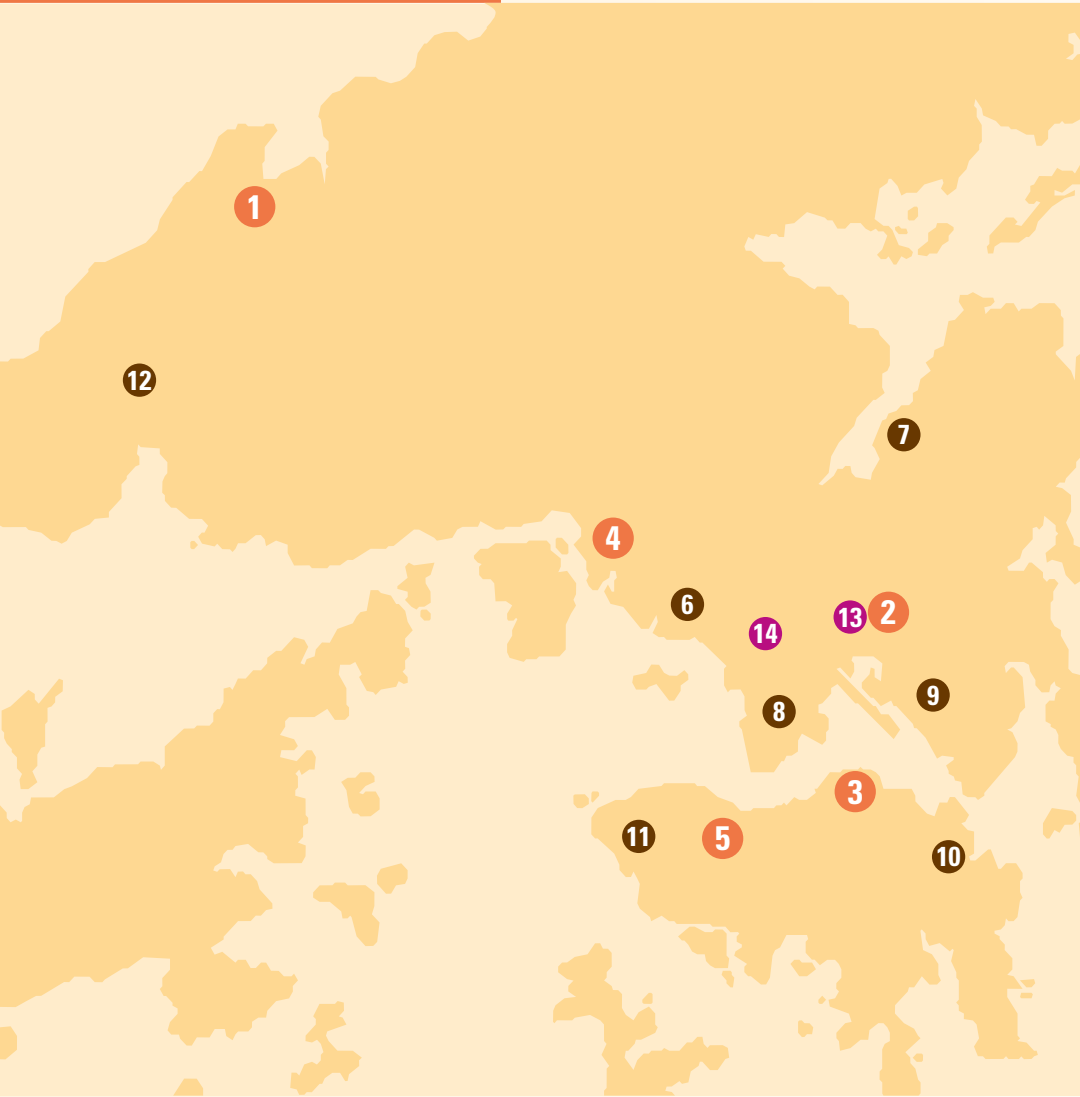
As we are expanding our services, we face an increasingly challenging fundraising environment. Our clients and their families need your support and care more than ever to sustain our programmes.

Achieving Our Mission

As Hong Kong's largest cancer support organisation, our mission is to ensure that no one faces cancer alone. Through our network of free support, spanning the hospital, the home and the community, we're committed

to making life better for people touched by cancer. We not only provide vital support to our patients and their families, we also help to improve hospital environments and drive public awareness of cancer.

Free Help a Call Away

A total of 9,761 calls were received over the year by our registered nurses and trained social workers.

Our hotline offers guidance and support, referrals to services and aims to alleviate anxiety.

Our five centres saw 112,177 visits, equivalent to 370 a day. Our visitors were warmly welcomed and given free information, professional counselling and recommendations to a range of workshops and holistic therapies.

Empowering Individuals

Our centres provide an array of psychosocial workshops and therapeutic groups to rebuild our clients' self-esteem and confidence on the road to recovery. We had 43,334 total attendances with 1,625 programmes.

The Power of Peer Support

The Friends of CancerLink (F.O.C.) is a network of 22 self-help groups supported by volunteers who have been touched by cancer. These members provide peer support, rehabilitation services and encouragement to individuals. In the last year, we had a total of 16,236 members.

Centre for Special Needs

We're proud to support the New Voice Club to help laryngeal cancer patients in regaining their speaking voice again and to reintegrate into the community. Members of this club offer emotional and psychological support to patients and their carers through hospital visits and they offer special vocal trainings. They also run recreational activities such as

two choirs through their peer support network and volunteer trainings. In the last year, there were 4,259 members. Volunteers from the club also assist those affected by laryngeal cancer in mainland China to regain their voice, to rehabilitate and to reintegrate into the community. It was founded by Frank Greenhalgh in 1984.





Bringing Hope and Confidence into Young People's Lives

We provide assistance at all stages of cancer to help our clients navigate the many transitions and changes of treatment and recovery. Our five Cancer Fund Support Centres respond to the practical, psychological, family and peer support needs of all people touched by cancer through consultations, programmes, workshops and supportive services. In the 2017-2018 year, we had 112,177 visits at our five centres and saw 4,086 new users.

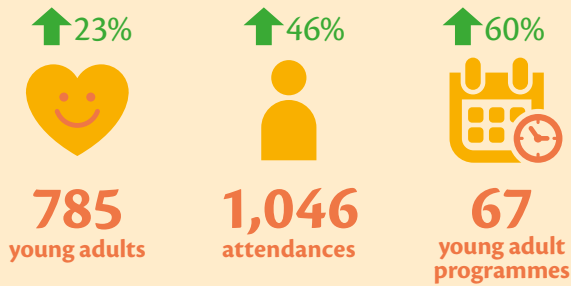

Helping Children: Our Rainbow Club Programme

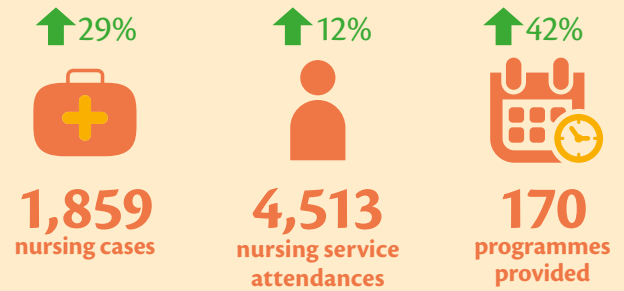
Rainbow Club helps children who have a family member with cancer, or who have lost someone to cancer. The programme takes place at our centres in the community and includes our programme at Tuen Mun Hospital, addressing the needs of bereaved children. Over the last year, we saw an increase in the number of children reached by 11%.

Young Adult Programme



Young adults touched by cancer face unique challenges concerning confidence and self-image issues. Our frontline staff helped 785 young adult clients at our centres (23% increase from last year) through 67 programmes.

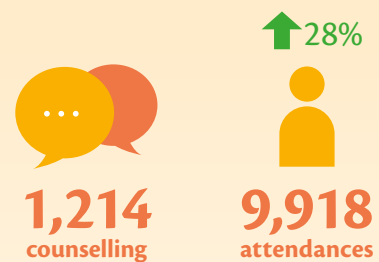

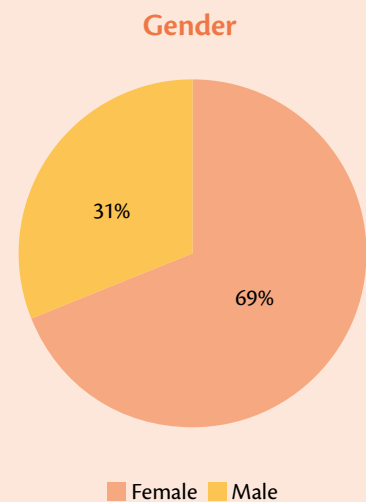
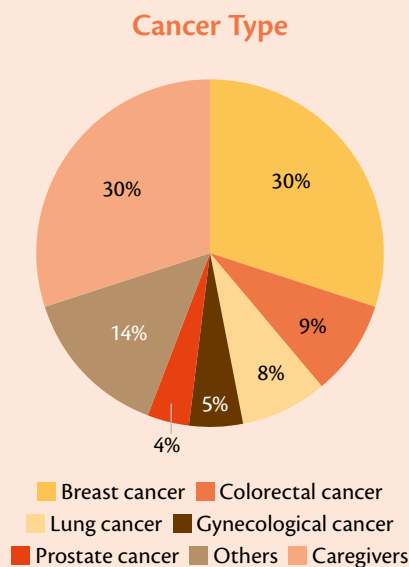
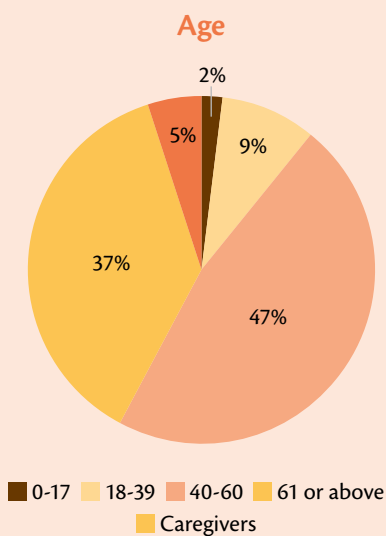
Our oncology nurses provide timely medical and psychosocial support to help traumatised clients, families and caregivers cope with the physical aspects of living with cancer. Our nurses understand the needs of patients and caregivers and work closely with our social workers to ensure that patients have adequate support in their homes.

New Cancer Support Centre Opens in Kwai Chung

To Help Thousands More Families and Ensure No One Faces Cancer Alone



As we celebrated our 30th Anniversary, we expanded our ever growing network with the official opening in June 2017 of our CancerLink Jockey Club Support Centre in Kwai Chung. On the opening day, the sound of drumming by cancer survivors and volunteers reverberated through the large space, with officiating guests including Professor John Leong, Chairman of the Hospital Authority, Mr Leong Cheung, Executive Director, Charities and Community, The Hong Kong Jockey Club and Mrs

Sally Lo, Founder and Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Cancer Fund.

The Kwai Chung support centre extends our support services to New Territories West. The 7,300 sq.ft new centre is our largest support service centre, providing free and professional services including counselling, family support, diet and nutrition consultation, art therapy, symptoms and side effects management, body-mind-spiritual programmes, financial assistance and so much more.



International Cancer Research & Collaboration

We support both local and international cutting edge cancer research projects. We help academics, doctors and medical specialists to target cancer research on nasopharynx cancer and cancers of colorectal, ovarian and liver fibrosis. Through ongoing collaborations with Cancer Research UK, The Chinese University of Hong Kong and many other leading cancer organisations, we maintain close relationships in the international cancer community. We hope that by supporting international innovations and breakthroughs in cancer treatment and care, people living with cancer in Hong Kong will benefit as this knowledge is incorporated into local practice.

Hereditary Gastrointestinal Cancer Programme by The University of Hong Kong and St. Paul's Hospital.

Clinical Trial of the MVA EBV (Epstein-Barr virus) vaccine in NPC patients in Hong Kong by Prince of Wales Hospital and Chinese University of Hong Kong. (This has been funded since 2005).

Affordable Multi-gene Mutation-Drug Matching for Chemo-refractory Ovarian Cancer Patients in Hong Kong by the Chinese University of Hong Kong.

International

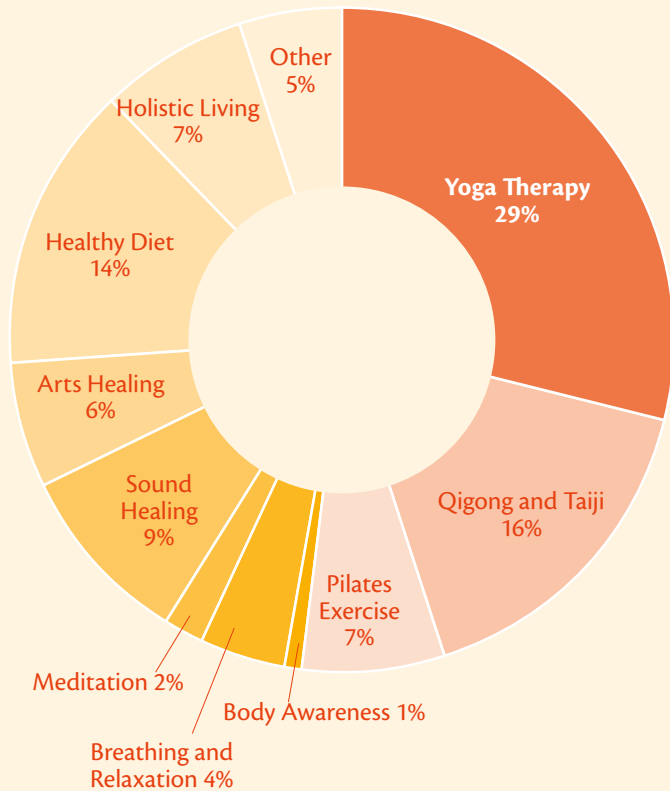
European Organization for Research and Treatment of Cancer (EORTC)

We have contributed important data and funding to the European Organization for Research and Treatment of Cancer (EORTC). The EORTC works internationally and across multiple disciplines to improve the standard of cancer treatment through clinical research and ultimately improve cancer survival rates.


The EORTC is making exciting developments through the testing of existing and new cancer drugs, surgery and/or radiotherapy for both rare and common tumour types. We have supported this international research for almost 30 years.

The mindfulness-based wellness programmes help our clients and their families to understand the deep connection between body and mind, to cultivate a state of inner peace and harmony, and to promote self-healing to enhance quality of life.

Since 2011, we began to offer wellness programmes. Over the last 7 years, we have seen increasing demand. Our wellness programmes are taught by 96 facilitators and 61 teaching assistants and programme volunteers.

The most popular programmes included yoga therapy, pilates, taiji, qigong, sound healing and healthy diet programmes. We offered these programmes at more than 30 locations including the five Cancer Fund Support Centres and outreach venues.

The feedback from the users was very encouraging and indicated positive changes in their body, mind and spirit after they attended the programmes.



Proud to Support

Friends of CancerLink: Important Partners in the Cancer Journey

Peers serve as important sources of encouragement and vital information to those touched by cancer. We provide a networking platform for 22 volunteer self-help groups called Friends of CancerLink (F.O.C.), which we fund. These support groups specialize in different types of cancer for members to share their experiences, gain much needed emotional support from fellow survivors and engage in activities. Many of the F.O.C. groups meet at the Cancer Fund Support Centres while receiving full support and guidance on needs-specific programmes from our social workers.

“Friends of CancerLink are the sunshine after the rain”. This is the winning catchphrase in the Tagline Competition that we organized recently, and is the work by Wai Ngor, Chairperson of the Sunflower Network, a self-help group for survivors of breast and female

cancers. The Sunflower Network is one of 22 volunteer support groups under F.O.C. that have formed a close partnership with us to provide seamless care and support to patients and their families.

“This is what I truly feel about the collaboration with Cancer Fund over the years,” Wai Ngor said.

This one-of-a-kind volunteer-based network in Hong Kong has a strong membership of 16,236 people, including cancer patients and survivors, who offer peer support to one another. Their invaluable firsthand experience continues to make a big difference in many.

Wai Ngor is an active participant in the Sunflower Network and a cancer survivor. In 2004, when Wai Ngor was diagnosed with breast cancer, she had no idea where to find help. She felt very alone. She was devastated when more cancer cells were found after

her first partial mastectomy which required a second surgery.

“I found it difficult to take in this diagnosis and I was so grateful to the nurse who referred me to the Sunflower Network,” she explained.

It was a turning point for Wai Ngor when she received a timely phone call from a volunteer of the Sunflower Network. It was reassuring to hear from a survivor.

Now, Wai Ngor shares her experiences with other patients, helping to lift their spirits. After she no longer needed chemotherapy, she wore her wig to go visit others in the hospital.

DIY Fundraising

We launched our DIY fundraising platform in 2010 and it keeps expanding each year.

Last year, our supporters raised HK\$932,627 through 16 DIY projects during 2017-18 through their own initiatives (taking part in activities such as running marathons and cycling challenges). DIY fundraising gives individuals and companies an opportunity to create a personalised webpage to promote their fundraising activity on our online and social media platforms. Anyone can design a unique webpage for a special event or activity, and invite friends or colleagues to make a donation directly to Hong Kong Cancer Fund.



HK\$932,627 was raised through 16 DIY projects during 2017-18, a 578% increase in donations from last year

A Little Run Around Hong Kong: Compelled to make a difference for those touched by cancer

For 37 years, Tam Chi-keung worked as a social worker on the frontlines. He has come into contact with at least 1,000 cancer patients while working at the oncology department of a hospital for 4 years. He often referred clients to the Hong Kong Cancer Fund to receive holistic services including emotional and mental health support.

Tam, 64, later learned the Cancer Fund relied solely on the generosity of donors with no government funding.

After Tam retired in 2014, he began to envision combining his passion for giving back to the community with his love for running marathons to fundraise for our Cancer Fund's free services. He first organized a 7 day marathon called "A Little Run Around Hong Kong" to bring people together to make a difference on December 3 to 9, 2017. To his surprise, Tam and his fellow marathoners exceeded expectations and raised HK\$297,173.

"One life can bring light to another life. Everyone has the power to help others," said Tam, a slim athletic-looking man with kind eyes.

The seven day marathon drew 120 people, around half of the participants were cancer survivors and several people from Taiwan flew in. Each day, runners covered 20 kilometres throughout Hong Kong starting from Tsim Sha Tsui's clock tower to Sham Tseng, then on to Yuen Long and running to places like Stanley and the end point was Sun Yat Sen Memorial Park. The entire journey spanned 150 kilometres.

Tam encourages all cancer patients to run for health and to gain inspiration from fellow runners. He personally designed a special route for cancer patients that had stable low pathways. "The cancer patients

were happy to be running with us. They said they could only run 2 to 3 kilometres on their own, but could run longer distances when running together," he said.

He describes it as a labour of love when he recounts that the entire marathon was organized over 12 months which included recruiting runners, booking hotels for runners from Taiwan to arranging car rides and obtaining permission from the police. "I feel I've benefited the most. I'm very happy," he said, tearing up. In 2018, Tam organized another 7 day marathon called "A Little Run Around Hong Kong and Macau" and raised more than \$200,000.

Stride for a Cure

Stride for a Cure is our annual walkathon that brings medical professionals, hospital groups, peers support groups, corporations and the general public together at Tai Tam Country Park to raise funds to support local cancer research projects. After the half day walk, during the coldest walkathon we have ever had on 17 December 2017, we enjoyed lively entertainment by many of our cancer survivors and volunteers. The Cancer Fund also organises Run for a Cure at the same time to provide flexibility for people who want to raise funds on their own schedule and run in their own preferred locations.

Pink Revolution

Pink Revolution is our important fundraising campaign held between September and October to raise funds for our breast cancer services. The main events were Shop for Pink and Dress Pink Day held on 27 October in 2017. For the Shop for Pink campaign, 27 high street brands joined in to raise funding for the cause. During Dress Pink Day, there were 3,691 participants including staff from 122 corporations.

Our Pink Revolution campaign kick-off event took place on 15 September 2017 at The ONE shopping mall in Tsim Sha Tsui. Celebrities Joyce Cheng, 鄭欣宜, singer and actress; international model Kathy Chow 周汶綺 and film director Kearen Pang 彭秀慧 brought their star power to help raise awareness.



Movember

Movember is a global organisation that raises awareness of men's health and supports men's health related projects. In Hong Kong, Movember supported our holistic services for men with prostate cancer.

Building a Cancer Smart City

More than 31,400 new cancer cases were diagnosed in Hong Kong in 2016, an all-time record high with 1,150 more cases compared with the year before.* Our education campaigns are designed to change the mindsets of the Hong Kong people to become more cancer-aware and willing to take measures to lower risk.

Our four public health education campaigns reached more than 3.8 million people in Hong Kong and raised awareness of the top ranked cancers in the city: colorectal, skin, breast and prostate. There was an increasing positive response from the general public as we reached more people through more outdoor and online campaigns. After each campaign, the impact is measured by those taking action through a media survey by Nielsen.

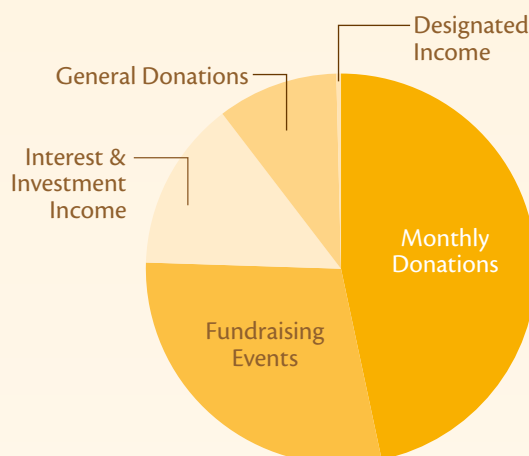

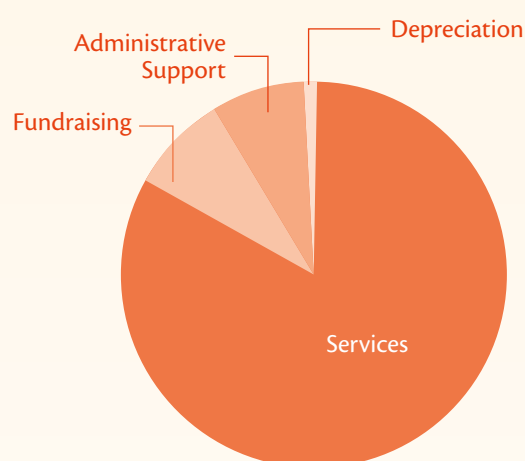
Total Income **HK\$121,744,823**

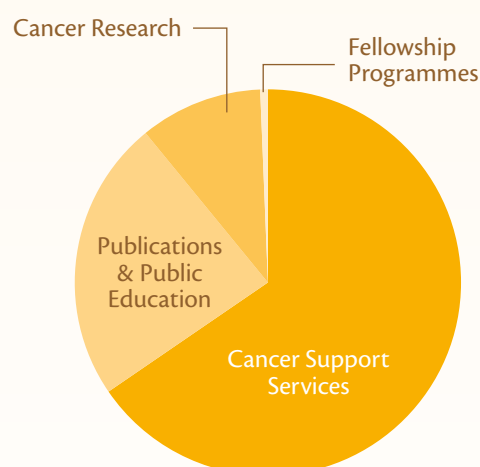
Total Expenditure **HK\$101,797,347**

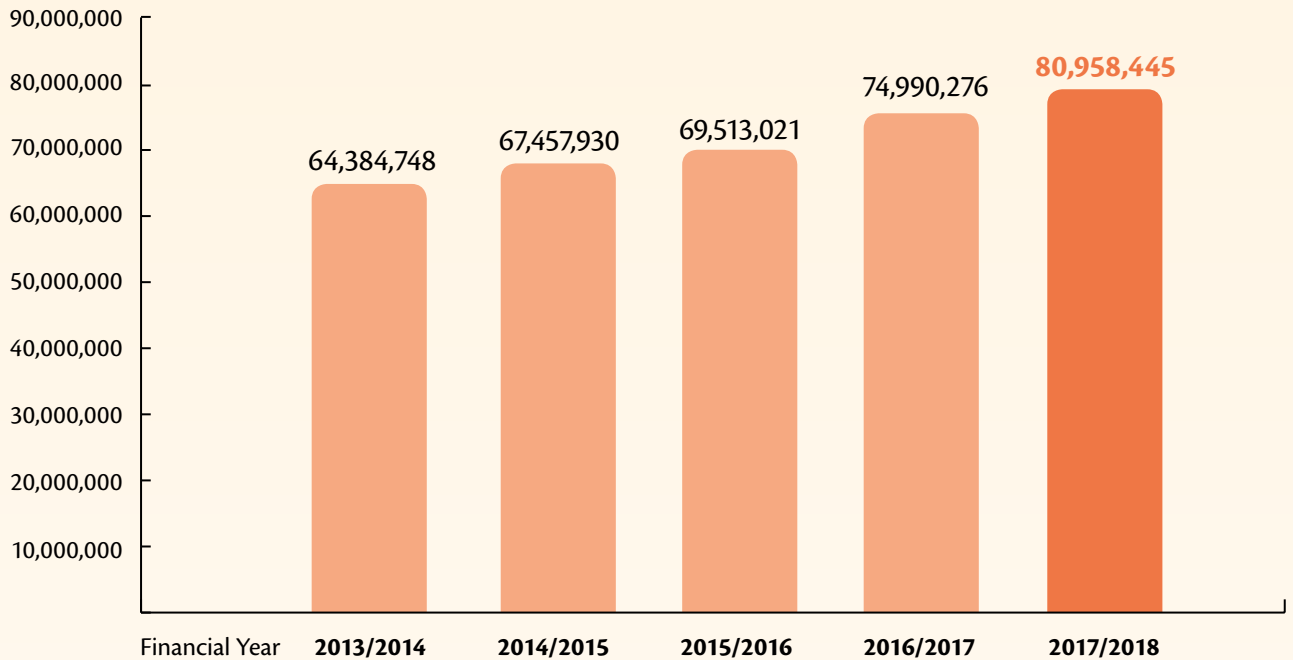

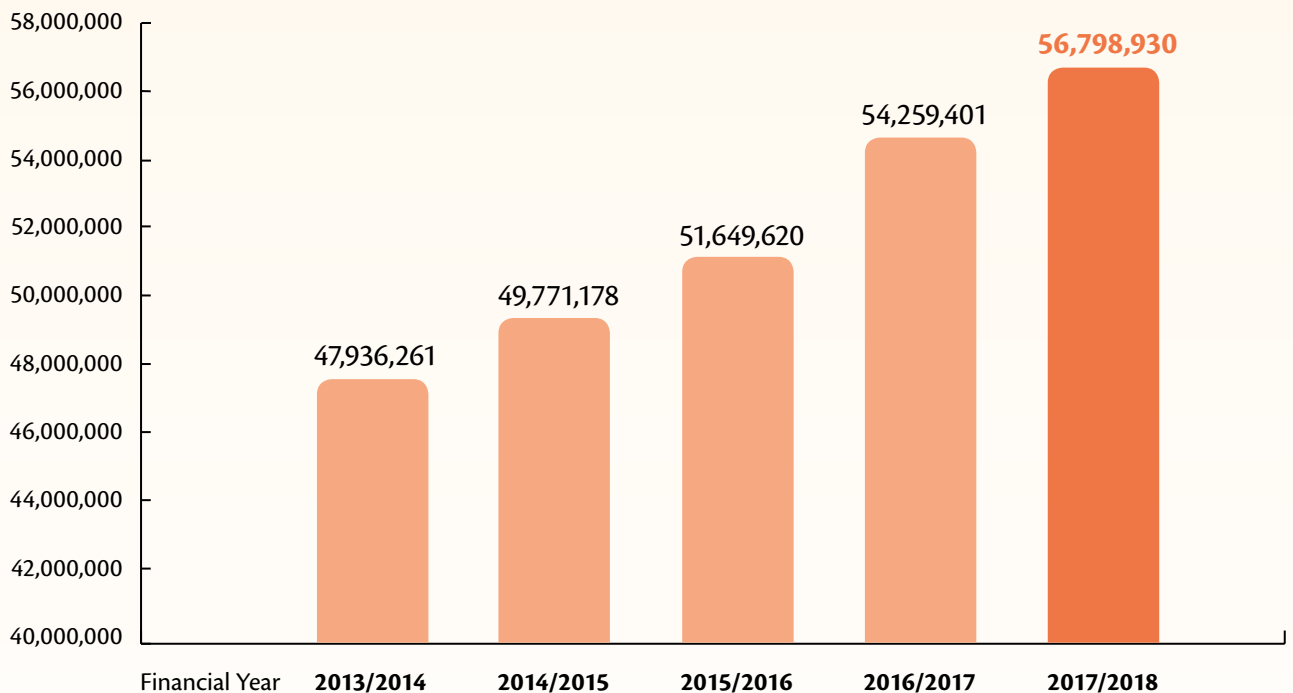
Services: 5 Year Development
