The Operation Henry Trust helps individuals across the UK who have been diagnosed with Pancreatic Cancer by providing support services to both them and their families. Our services are free of charge and help to reduce stress, trauma and financial anxieties by providing anything that may help them through this difficult time and improve their quality of life.

What does The Operation Henry Trust Do?

The Operation Henry Trust offers support to pancreatic cancer sufferers and their families throughout the UK where there are limited resources. The Charity helps to reduce stress, trauma, and financial anxieties, and we do this by paying for support and services on their behalf.

What support services do we provide?

We tend to help in four main areas - transport, financial assistance, home maintenance and respite breaks, however we understand that everyone's needs are different and each person is contacted to find out what their individual needs are and how we can help them. We provide a unique service for each recipient to make sure that they get the very best support for their personal situation and needs.

How much does this cost?

We typically limit each family to receiving £500 worth of support although there is some flexibility depending upon the individual requirements. If recipients are receiving a weekly service (for instance help with the cleaning or gardening) then we are transparent about how many hours we will be able to provide and how many weeks of the service this will cover. We have found that this transparency really helps give peace of mind to those suffering from pancreatic cancer that even if they are no longer around their family will continue to receive the support for as long as we can provide it.

Our Objective:

Over the next 5 years we aim to reach more people so that they can benefit from the range of support services we offer, we are doing this by reaching out to hospitals, cancer clinics and support groups to ensure that everybody who may require our assistance is aware of our existence. The funds raised by this project will be used exclusively to support pancreatic cancer patients and their families and will help provide us with the security to expand our services while remaining confident we can support everybody who comes to us needing help
