What we do

We help disadvantaged students in poor countries to complete their training as health workers. Medic to Medic is a UK charity set up in 2007 by Kate Mandeville, a British doctor who was born in Malawi. We support medical students, primarily through the donations of other doctors.

Our mission is to tackle the root causes of health and education inequality. We help poor students training to be doctors, pharmacists, physiotherapists, health managers and clinical officers and nurses by covering their tuition fees and necessary allowances, so that they can successfully become health workers in their home country.

Our aims

More health workers

- To support trainee healthcare workers throughout their education, so that they can perform to the best of their ability.
- To add to the absolute number of health workers in training, so that there are more graduates in countries with critical shortages.

Equity and access

- We target those who are under represented in the health professions, such as women or those in rural areas.
- To increase the number of healthcare workers working in rural areas.

Awareness

- Raise awareness of the different conditions facing healthcare professionals worldwide and an appreciation of the global health community.



How we work

We support medical students and other trainee healthcare workers through their education. Our supporters sign up to sponsor a student and are linked to an individual. These students then send regular updates on their progress, which we pass on to their donors. Some students are even mentored by their sponsor. Donations are pooled so that if a donor withdraws, no one student is disadvantaged.
