What is paediatric palliative care?

Paediatric palliative care aims to enhance the quality of life of children and adolescents with life limiting and life threatening conditions. It focuses on managing the child's pain and symptoms while providing social, emotional and spiritual care and supporting families through bereavement.



Who are we?

Tracey Brand and Dr Julia Ambler are the Director and Deputy Director of Umduduzi respectively and together have been the driving force behind the organisation since 2013. Julia received her qualification in paediatric palliative care from the University of Cardiff and has worked in the field since 2003. Tracey is a social worker and has read for a Master of Social Work (Clinical Practice). She has been involved in palliative care since 2008.

Both Julia and Tracey are involved in the teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate medical students through the Department of Paediatrics, Nelson Mandela Medical School, UKZN. They have been involved in the development of a paediatric palliative care curriculum for health care professionals.

 - Emotional and spiritual support
 - End of life care

- 2 We teach, train, mentor and support health professionals throughout KZN to provide palliative care to children.
- 3 The Umduduzi team is actively involved in policy development for palliative care at both provincial and national levels.
