### WHY RISE?

#### In India:

19% of 10-year-olds are not literate in their mother tongue

46% of 10-year-olds are 3 years behind national reading level

25% of students drop-out by the age of 10

#### In the UK:

88% of British businesses recognise that workforce with the right skills is critical

73% of business leaders believe a skills crisis will hit the UK within the next three years

32% said they face skills shortages for entry-level positions

Sampa, her parents and her 4 brothers and sisters live in a 2 room bamboo house with no electricity. Her father is a labourer and her mother cuts grass which brings in an income of circa £500 per year.
