Love is Blind Project Sites

Bethel's Love Is Blind (LIB) Program is the banner that we run all of our foster care, education, therapy, and medical care under. The Bethel project sites include four loctaions: Beijing, Zhengshou, Jiaozou, and Nanjing. At full operational capacity, the combined sites offer services for up to 85 children.

Bethel also utilizes the project sites to strengthen local institutions by delivering workshops, distance learning, consultancy and training materials to expand the capacity of caregivers (teachers, orphange workers, extended family etc.) to provide quality care to children with visual impairments.



Since 2011, Bethel's Outrach Program has enabled us to reach children and their caregivers all over the country and give them the training, medical care and more support they need. Families, schools, hospitals and orphanages representing thousands of children have received training in foster care, daily living skills, and orientation and mobility. Bethel's Outreach Program has produced its own original educational DVD series and manual which is distributed throughout China to assist those raising a blind or visually impaired child. Bethel's national public service advertisements, who have reached tens of thousands of people are aimed to promote the blind and visual impaired community and lower the negative stigma often associated with blindness.






Budget & Support

Bethel's priority is responsible, transparent, financial sustainability. Our main need is to raise funds to cover running costs. Major costs include the medical care of our children, their food and clothing, our teachers and caregivers salary and the cost to rent our facilities. Our fundraising sources include: Foundations, corporate partnerships, churches, individuals and events. For 2018, Bethel's annual budget is 3,304,530 RMB (\$525,651 USD). 
