Safeplan Uganda 2016

Focus area 2016/2017

1. **Economic empowerment** for young and single mothers in Budongo and Pakany Sub county.
2. **Health education** with emphasis on adolescent girls and breast feeding mothers in Karujubi and Miirya Sub county.
3. **Improving the nutrition** of families by practicing subsistence agriculture and backyard gardening for people living with HIV in partnership with Masindi hospital and health centre IIIs in the sub counties.

Strategies:

- ⇒ Engage community leaders, stakeholders and local authorities to mobilize target beneficiaries.
- ⇒ Conduct school based reproductive health programme to expand the outreach activities.
- ⇒ Engage in self sustaining income generating enterprises easy to start easy to manage.
- ⇒ Partner with qualified health service providers to offer services to vulnerable groups PWDs, women and children.

Current Program reports

1. **Health:** Between 2013/14 through local partnership in and service delivery trained more than 400 PLHA in four sub counties in Masindi.



Currently supporting 100 vulnerable rural school girls aged 13-16yrs in education with cloth sanitary pads usable up to 1 year purposely to keep at school, reduce absenteeism and risk of being lured into early relationship and marriage. Under this program 20 mothers are producing high value, solar dried green vegetables for sale to patients at the main hospital to ensure improved nutrition.



Community driven programme in Karujubi Sub county.

2. **Environment:** Safeplan Uganda supports Budongo Women Bee Farmers with skills for economic empowerment as a means of gaining self reliance and reduce vulnerability to HIV infections. Over 40 women have benefited and are now harvesting honey and enough food for the family. The community have managed to protect 2 water resources for to assist in their community early childhood centre in Nyantonzi.
