Q2 Impact Report



As the end of Q2 is quickly approaching, the Chef Ann Foundation has made some big achievements. To date, CAF has helped over **3,000,000 children** in **9,600 schools** access healthy, delicious food through these programmatic achievements:

60,030

free tools and resources have been downloaded from The Lunch Box, by over **13,350 registered users** from more than **7,060 schools**, to improve their school food programs.

85,790

children have received lunchroom nutrition education through our Project Produce grant. As a result, 78% of those schools report an increase in their fresh fruit and vegetable purchases.

37,250

children are now being offered healthier food from the participating districts in our Get Schools Cooking program.

2.6

million children have daily access to a variety of fresh fruits and vegetables from the **5,349 salad bars** we have granted since 2010.

87%

of students who have taken a School Food Institute course report they will use the information learned to make positive change in their school food operations.

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Impact Investment Opportunities

- 1. <u>School Food Institute</u> provides school food workers with professional development education to make sustainable change to school food operations while acquiring skills to advance their careers.
 - 646 course seats have been filled by 118 school food workers primarily in Colorado and Northern California, thanks to the scholarship funding provided by the Colorado Health Foundation (CHF) and EACH Foundation.
 - Our grant with the CHF is coming to an end for Colorado food service professionals, and we hope to continue supporting them with new partnerships.
 - We are seeking funding to provide scholarships throughout the country. Support your state with a workforce development grant:

- 2. Transforming Lunchroom Environments: We are seeking partners to support the pilot of the <u>Learning Lunchrooms</u> program. Along with IDEO Design, we envision leveraging everyday objects in the lunchroom to create an engaging learning experience around food and nutrition for K-5 students.
- 3. <u>Project Produce</u> nutrition education grant applicants have recently been selected, and there are several districts now on our waitlist. This is an impactful opportunity which introduce children to fresh fruits, vegetables, and scratch-cooked recipes along with food literacy and peer-to-peer marketing programming in your focus areas:
