BESO Foundation is a Ugandan grass-root organization founded in 2010 that works in rural Uganda to provide Children, Women and Youth access to quality education, health services and economic empowerment.



Background

BESO Foundation was founded in 2008 by Aaron Bukenya. Aaron grew up in Wanteete village, Bugerere County in Kayunga District, Uganda and was the only child in his village sent to the capital to enjoy a quality education. As an adult and a teacher by profession, Aaron observed the vast differences in his quality of life in comparison to his siblings and neighbors.

He started by reaching out to Kampala schools who equally shared his passion and provided half bursary to 350 students from his village, at this point the concept of starting the grass root organization took shape and founded Bugerere Education Support Organisation "BESO Foundation"

 Support teachers, equip and mentor teachers with modern teaching technics and technologies to deliver quality education and skills to unlock a better future for a child.



• **Organize** families and local women into Village Savings and Loan Associations and support them with training in agriculture, business, microfinancing and health initiatives to improve lives



Why we do what we do?

- **52%** of Uganda's population is under the age of 15.
- **67.6%** of children who enroll in primary school drop out before reaching grade seven.
- 25% of Ugandan women are not paid for the work they perform.
- **84%** of Ugandan teachers want to quit.
- **250 million** children worldwide graduating from Primary school without the ability to read, write or count well

Outcomes of what we do?

- Better student learning outcomes.
- Improved teaching practices.
- Increased confortable learning environment
- Increased completion rate.
- Increased household income and standard of living.

Theory of change!

Our Theory of Change is that better school infrastructure equipped with technology, improved teacher teaching practices, increased household income leads to quality education, which in turn, results in the future leaders of tomorrow and able to make significant contribution to the development of society.

The St.Mark School story!

In 2010, a child called Mark Mubiru of 6 years was knocked to death by a local taxi motorcycle while taking a long walk of 5 miles to the nearest school from this community, Wanteete. At that school, 100+ students are crammed into one room. Driven by this injustice, Aaron- BESO founder joined with 80 mothers from his village and successfully received a microgrant of \$1,600 from Spark Microgrants to start the first school in his community. They enlisted him, a son of the village, as a good example because he was fortunate to get a good education and start a grassroots organization, BESO Foundation. Together with the mothers, BESO worked to start a school for Mark and other children like him. The school opened in 2011 with 100 students, 2 teachers, with temporary shelter with only a roof as classrooms and on quarter piece of land.



Improved livelihoods, ambitions and smiles cannot be quantified, but we have done our best to break our community impact down into numbers.

• 10 Communities in Kayunga District are served

EMPLOYMENT

• 34 full time staffs employed, all Ugandans. And 20 casual laborers employed from the community at the school.

Our Impact

EDUCATION INITIATIVE

- A Nursery and Primary Model school in Wanteete Village established. It sits on 5 acres of land
- 514 brightest but poor children attend BESO's <u>St. Mark Primary School</u> on full scholarships
- 840 total children have received access to education through BESO directly
- 1,760 children have received quality education through BESO's Teacher Mentorship Initiative in Kayunga District in partnership with STiR Education.

Our Impact

LIVELIHOODS INITIATIVE

- 500+ acres cultivated, 100 tons of food produced.
- 2,400+ family members reached
- 6 Village Savings and Loan association groups have been formed.
 - 100 households "Women" participate in each.
- 50 pregnant mothers enabled to deliver with the support of a qualified a health worker
