mpowering Women for Excellence Initiative is a Non-Governmental Organisation based in Kaduna, Nigeria. Registered by the Corporate Affairs Commission of Nigeria (CAC/IT/28137) and with Kaduna State Government Ministries of NGOs/Youth and Sports, and Education/Women Affairs, EWEI is committed to the empowerment of girls and women through enlightenment. Since 2008, we have supported education more than twenty indigent teenage girls, and reached out to cumulatively over twelve thousand women/girls and more than ten Kaduna State communities via advocacy campaigns, capacity building, information dissemination, cross-cutting community service projects and other multi-sectoral interventions. We reach thousands more daily through our newsletters and online media content.

Our coverage continues to address with modest success, thematic social issues such as gender equity/participation, violence against women, girl child education, and women economic empowerment. Because our interventions are embedded with sustainability and regenerative potential, programme dividends have continued to trickle down to innumerable children, households and communities associated with our beneficiaries.

Our strategic development projects include Economic Empowerment Partnership (EEP), Educational Subsidy Programme (ESP), Empowerment Seminar (ES), Civic Education and Partnership for Women Project (CEPWOP), Getting Involved (GI), and Know-and-Say-No (KSN). We retain a meek collection of instructional materials, facilitators, and research analysts on associated subjects. We have partnered with public agencies, private foundations and organisations of repute, both local and international, on various concepts related to the rights and cause of women/girl child. Our initiatives are informed or guided much by domestic research, as by global plans of action and strategic goals, such as the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs); Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW); Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action (PFA); UN Security Council resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security; African Union Protocol on the Rights of Women in Africa; Nigerian National Gender Policy and Child Rights Act among others.
