



OUR VISION


CAMELEON aspires to a world without sexual violence.

- TO ADVOCATE for Children's Rights and against sexual violence to local, national and international institutions and the media.




OUR FOUNDRESS

After several years travelling and volunteering in the Philippines, Laurence LIGIER was only 25 years old when she saw an enormous need to help the sexually-abused survivor girls. In 1997, she left her family and friends to found an NGO in Iloilo (Western Visayas Region) named CAMELEON Association.

Quickly, her initiative grew and became an important actor in the Philippines: a few years after its foundation, CAMELEON Association was accredited by the Department of Social Work and Development in the country; opened 2 shelters for girl victims of sexual abuse, organized several events gathering communities and developed the administrative core of the Association by opening branches and partnerships in France, Switzerland, Luxembourg, Andorra, United-States and Belgium.

In 2017, CAMELEON celebrated its **20**th **anniversary**. A milestone for Laurence and her team, as it emphasized the importance of their actions and the seriousness of their work.

ABOUT CAMELEON ASSOCIATION INC.

CAMELEON Association Inc. is a non profit, non-government organization founded in 1997 by French national Laurence Ligier, which rehabilitates sexually abused girls in Western Visayas, and provides educational support and sustainable livelihood opportunities to economically disadvantaged children and their families.

CAMELEON is registered by the **Security and Exchange Commission** and duly accredited by the **(DSWD) Department of Social Welfare and Development** and **by PCNC (Philippine Council for NGOs Certification).**

CAMELEON develops a holistic approach to act on the causes and effects of sexual violence towards children and teenagers through:

- **PROTECTING AND SUPPORTING** victims of sexual violence in the Philippines by accompanying them with their families on the path to resilience.
- **ENCOURAGING** our beneficiaries' autonomy and the socio-economic development of families in their communities.
- **TRAINING AND ACCOMPANYING** beneficiaries and encourage them to get involved as spokespersons and active supporters of CAMELEON.
- RAISING AWARENESS among the general public, especially young people in the Philippines and in Europe, in order to promote Children's Rights and free their voices from sexual violence.
- **ADVOCATING** for Children's Rights and against sexual violence to local, national and international institutions and the media.







WHY SUPPORT US?

- A program **on the ground for 20 years** recognized and legitimated by public authorities
- A human-size organisation with a local team composed only of Filipinos, working together with the communities where it intervenes
- The teams **accompany each children** in the long term, up until university graduation, while at the same time preparing them for adulthood.
- The Association **supports families** in becoming more aware of their role as parents and encourages the preservation of family ties.
- Through **the practice of circus**, an unknown discipline in the Philippines used as an innovative therapeutic tool, the victims reclaim their bodies.
- The **energy and the determination** of the foundress is transmitted to the teams, the children and the parents who take ownership of the project bit by bit with audacity, passion and pride.
- The individual sponsorship: under its supervision, the Association favors the bound and exchanges between children and their sponsors.



WHY IS CAMELEON UNIQUE?


CAMELEON is the only **local association** that offers individual and long-term care for young girls who have been victims of sexual violence, until their full recovery and empowerment. CAMELEON brings **innovative solutions**, such as the practice of Circus art as a therapeutic tool and means of professional integration, to help young girls rebuild themselves.

Theater-forum is used as part of the **awareness-raising and prevention activities**. The Association has the particularity of being located in remote rural areas that have difficult access to basic services, resources and needs. The success of CAMELEON's actions lies in a **participatory approach** where the beneficiaries become actors of their own future, by teaching and informing other youth or by becoming Ambassadors of Children's Rights and Health.



CAMELEON's action is based on a **comprehensive and long-term approach**, accompanied by family and community support, to defend Children's Rights and to provide a better future for abused children. CAMELEON works as a **holistic system**, where all aspects of the child's well-being are integrated (education, health, prevention, legal care, sports, advocacy). The Programs are inclusive, working with the children, their families, the communities and the local authorities, in order to provide a global response to the issues of sexual violence.

CAMELEON PROJECT IN NEGROS

In Negros Occidental, there was no organization that offers specialized help for sexually abused girls. With 22 years of experience in running rehabilitation shelters in Panay island (Iloilo, Passi City), CAMELEON wants to duplicate its action by opening a new one in Negros in order to protect more victims. With about 30% of the girls beneficiaries of our In-house and After-care program coming from Negros, our extension in the province aims at two goals for 20 girls aged 5 to 17 years old:

- -To offer shelter and rehabilitation support to victims of sexual abuse in Negros Occidental.
- -To facilitate the work with the families of the beneficiaries and the monitoring of After-care program to ensure the reintegration of the girls.

The 8,000 sqm land was donated to CAMELEON by the local government of Silay City wherein one (1) rehabilitation center, one (1) administrative/clinical office and additional buildings will be built.

20 girls who have been victims of sexual abuse will be provided with the opportunity to go to school, participate in sports & circus, and receive medical/psychological care as well as legal assistance when they are determined to sue their perpetrators.

CAMELEON also raises awareness on Children's Rights at local and national levels through its ADVOCACY Program.







The project is co-financed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Luxembourg (66%) and for the private contribution (34%) by our partners Cooperation Humanitaire Luxembourg (CHL), NIF Foundation (Luxembourg), Talents & Partage (France), CDC (France) and BDO Foundation.

CAMELEON has two (2) contractors for this project:

- A.N.N Enterprise & Services is supervising the entire construction
- Make It Right Realty is in charge of the construction of the Home Building, replaced by Fang at the end of the project











THE ACTUAL SITE

In January 2018, Mark Golez (City Mayor of Silay), Laurence Ligier (Foundress of CAMELEON), Mario Derequito and Rose Espinosa (BDO Foundation representatives), and Bishop Patricio Buzon inaugurated the launching of the construction of the Silay Home in the island of Negros Occidental.












CAMELEON CENTER 3 DEVELOPMENT PLAN






