

On April 16, 2016

a catastrophic 7.8 earthquake caused 650 deaths and left more than 600,000 people homeless in Ecuador.



When there was no electricity, running water, schools or medical services, we packed our pet donkey with colorful books and "played Library" on the beach with the children of Don Juan.

Two years later *Fundación* A *mano manaba* is a non-profit organization that offers educational programs in Don Juan, a tiny fishing village in northern Manabí, Ecuador.



The Children's Library sits within a beautiful bamboo building in the center of the village.





We provide remedial reading programs, homework assistance, teacher training, arts and crafts workshops, adult education, taekwondo and self-defense training for girls and women.





Our main focus is on young girls. We believe that girls age 10-12 are the motor of a needed change in local gender dynamics that will unsettle the patriarchal domination that burdens women and children in this community.

International and national volunteers support us in areas such as science, technology or sports.
