

## Some startling statistics

- One woman dies of cervical cancer every 8 minutes in India.
- ▶ Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women in India and it accounts for 27% of all cancers in them.
- One in 28 women is likely to develop breast cancer during her life time.
- Estimated cancer patients living in India is 23 lakhs (2.3 M)
- ▶ 8 10 million cancer deaths occur annually across globe
- ▶ Incidence of cancer expected to rise five-fold by 2025





Can we work together to alleviate this problem of cancer?



### Death due to delayed diagnosis

- 70% of the patients coming for treatment are in final stages.
- ▶ 50% of this could have been prevented through early diagnosis (Source: Cancer Institute (WIA) Adyar).
- India is lagging behind developed nations, in such early diagnosis capability.
- It is the need of the hour to establish infrastructure for early diagnosis and save lives.

#### The "UU Model" for Cancer

- Udhavum Ullangal (UU) has <u>successfully implemented</u> a project in Tirunelveli for "Awareness creation, Screening & Early detection of <u>cancer</u> and follow up support"
- Conducted 568 camps in and Tirunelveli
- Awareness created for 45,682, screened 13,370 and treated 52 (lives saved), over the last 5 years.
- Around 500+ (high risk out of which 225 treated) are under observation for potential occurrence.

  - Medical doctor, Referral Doctor, Camp Coordinator,
  - Staff Nurses, Nursing Assistants, Lab Technicians,
  - Mobile Medical van
  - Tobacco cessation clinic
  - Chemotherapy lab
  - Cytopathology lab
  - Mini operation theatre
- Cytopathology laboratory set up with the help of experts from <u>Association of Indian Pathologists in North America</u>
- Training to the medical team is provided by <u>Cancer Institute</u>, <u>Adyar.</u>








# A typical Cancer Care Unit

- Will consist of
  - Medical doctor, Referral Doctor, Camp Coordinator,
  - Staff Nurses, Nursing Assistants, Lab Technicians,
  - Mobile Medical van
  - Tobacco cessation clinic
- Will cost
  - Cost of screening one person for cancer: \$ 10
  - Cost of screening 10 persons for cancer: \$ 100
  - Cost of screening 50 persons for cancer: \$ 500
- Will achieve :
  - Create awareness for: 6,000 annually
  - Screen 3,000 annually
  - May identify some cancer cases
  - Will follow up and provide treatment support

- Registered charitable trust since 2000
- Focus Areas:
  - Education
    - Providing scholarships to 500+ students in Tamil Nadu and for Rs. 40 lakhs every year
    - Mentoring 200 students to complete education successfully
    - Constructed infrastructure facilities for rural schools.
    - \* "supporting Rehabilitated Child Labour with education" at an annual cost of Rs.10 lakhs
  - Health (primarily cancer care)
    - Currently running a "Cancer screening and control programme", and created awareness among 45,682 people, screened 13,370 and extended support for 52 patients,
    - Above 568 camps have been conducted over the last 5 years in Southern rural Tamil Nadu and established a centre of Excellence.
  - Women Empowerment
    - ▶ Established Women Skill Development units in 3 of our centres
    - 2100 women have been trained in this program and most of them employed.
