

continue to spread awareness about the SEPALI program. All communities are already hard at work on the clove and rice harvest which will continue through December, but they are forward looking to working with SEPALI again in January.

NEWS FROM THE SEPALI DEMONSTRATION SITE:

The hunt is on! After a brief chrysalide drought at the SEPALI demonstration site, the SEPALI team has been hard at work collecting and producing *Suraka* to replenish the supply. The recent trip to Marovovonana yielded a basket of new chrysalides for the SEPALI site and trainer Denis Ramasy has been diligently producing hundreds of larvae in Manambia.

In addition to working with *Suraka*, SEPALI has recently begun experimenting with a new species of moth called *Ceranchia*.

This new species of moth is also native to NE Madagascar and feeds on a large host tree that grows in and around the forested areas. The species name of this tree has yet to be identified, but the SEPALI team has planted its seeds in a nursery to become familiar with the plant. SEPALI is particularly excited about experimenting with this species of moth because it can be used to produce a spun textile and it will add versatility to the SEPALI product line. SEPALI will begin to experiment with ceranchia in Ambinanitelo and Marovovonana.
