







Once upon a time there was a boy called Max. He decided to go on an adventure to Tanzania in Africa. He had always wondered what life was like there and was very excited to find out!









When Max got home he went to study at Nothingham university and couldn't stop thinking about the empty shelves.



With a bit of help, Max and his friends began to collect together and sort through all the disused books from the local secondary schools.



Max graduated from university in 2005 so his friends Rob, Nikki and Rachel delivered the first container of 25,000 textbooks to the girls and boys in Tanzania on his behalf.



Rob realised what a simple process this had been so he registered the project as a charity...and READ International was born.





In October 2007 READ International launched it's new vision, mission and values on the national stage in the Houses of Parliament in London.



Word spread fast and soon there were seventeen different student led READ Book Projects from all over the country collecting books and shipping them to Tanzania.



From this point on READ has operated as the first truly national schools textbook recycling operation. And it's all student volunteer led!





READ have joined with Oxfam to launch a new UK school presentation initiative, 'Think Global'. Our READ student volunteers deliver first hand presentations of their experience as global citizens, with training & support from Oxfam.



To date READ International have shipped 336,000 textbooks to Tanzania. Along with several tons of sports equipment and Stationery. Soon they will look beyond Tanzania and spread across East Africa.

Throughout the next year READ will work towards shipping over 300,000 books to Tanzania in August 2009. This year we will cross a significant landmark of shipping over half a million books to Tanzania. This is a superb achievement, especially considering we began just a couple of years ago. But now there are 4 full time staff, a board of trustees, and over 500 student volunteers involved. READ's vision for what it can achieve in the future is growing day by day.

## Delivering Our Mission

#### **READ Book Project**

We redistribute disused education resources from the UK to Tanzania. By making these resources available we are promoting literacy and healthy learning environments. What's more, we are providing opportunities for school children to become educated, empowered and engaged in their local and global community.

#### **Think Global**

We work in partnership with Oxfam GB to help young people in the UK identify with their local and global communities. Our volunteers deliver school workshops to open young people's minds to the positive impact that social enterprise, student volunteering, and global citizenship can have on tackling world issues. In doing this, we encourage young people to engage in our work and create their own student-led initiatives.

#### **READ Partnerships**

We have developed many partnerships to come this far. Our partner organisations include Kit Aid (together we provide sports equipment to schools in Tanzania), NoPC (together we deliver innovative and low-cost ICT solutions to schools in Tanzania), Oxfam GB (together we deliver the project, 'Think Global') and finally Better World Books (they help us sell the books which are not needed in Tanzania).

We will expand our project list over the coming years. Our doors will always be open to collaborative, student-led initiatives that tackle global issues through education. If a potential project fits our criteria and our values, then we will provide the support necessary to implement action.

# The Need in Tanzania

#### Tanzania is one of the poorest nations in the world.

In the UK nearly £7,000 is spent on every school pupil each year. This is compared to just £70 in Tanzania. Of this £70 only 30p is available for textbooks. Essential education resources are simply not available to Tanzanian students.





#### **Our Solution in the UK**

Tanzania's education resources are scarce, while the UK has a huge surplus. The Tanzanian secondary school syllabus is based almost entirely on the UK model and all lessons are taught in English!

Our huge network of over 500 student volunteers in the UK can collect, sort and redistribute hundreds of thousands of good quality but disused UK textbooks to Tanzania.

### How can you help?

## 1 Donate Textbooks

Do you have disused textbooks to dispose of? We focus on the collection of Primary school, Secondary School, and University level textbooks. We can arrange a free collection from any school, college or university in England.

We do not believe any book is better than none. In brief, we collect, sort and then send the most relevant mathematics, physics, chemistry, biology, physical geography, and English language textbooks, and children's fiction books to Tanzania. Any book which is not relevant to Tanzania, we try to sell to help raise funds. All other books we recycle.
