Our Mission

To improve on healthcare delivery services at the rural, peri urban and urban communities on water and sanitation facilities, hygiene education, communicable and non - communicable diseases thus increasing life expectancy using best practices available.

Our vision

How we work:

- Community Health Programmes: These are inclusive of service delivery and trainings carried out at the grassroots level on home management of ailments, recognition of signs and symptoms and what to do when there is no doctor around. This proves to be very effective in improving the health of the family through the women and children who are mostly our target group in all our interventions for an improved society.
- 2. Advocacy: improving linkages between communities and their government, community based organisations and private sector. In doing so, we promote improved local governance and corporate social responsibility strategies of corporate bodies.
- 3. Consultancy services: We undertake consultancy services in developmental policies inclusive of designs of development plans for states and local government, gender mainstreaming, social economic research inclusive of research reliability tests and Environmental Studies.
