100% PROMISE...STUDIO SAMUEL applies 100% of revenue to our programs, in thanks to our US team consisting of volunteers experienced in their fields.

Studio Samuel's team travel\* to Ethiopia annually for site visits and to ensure partner and community relations remain strong. 2016 was a pivotal time, as our inaugural class of 25 girls began transitioning for their graduation; while the 100th girl entered for next term. Two girls, both of whom are orphans living in a household on <\$1.90USD/day, received college scholarships. 12 girls used skills they learned at our training center to start earning a part-time income, bringing food to the table for their homes. Key initiatives we implemented kept 250+ girls in school and granted computer access to 100 girls. All initiatives were implemented with full support of the community and girls' caregivers. Community, team-building and our ever-present mantra, Empowerment Without Pity, continue to be the driving force behind Studio Samuel.







Students in Studio Samuel's Occupational Training class learn basic sewing skills by making menstrual kits, which last three years. Kits are then distributed to girls in rural areas, who often drop out of school due to lack of feminine hygiene supplies during their periods.
