What is CASA?



CASA supports:

- highly trained volunteer advocates
- appointed by the court
- who serve as a voice for the best interest of abused and neglected children during the foster care court process.

CASA volunteers:

- spend time with the child building a trusting relationship.
- they also talk to teachers, foster parents, and therapists.
- provide the court with a complete picture of what is in the best case interest of the child.

Children in Foster Care



- All the children and youth we serve are dependents of the juvenile court in Contra Costa County as a result of abuse, neglect or abandonment by a parent or guardian
 - They are not part of the juvenile justice system
 - They are part of the court process through no fault of their own
 - They may be have been in numerous foster homes and schools
 - They may not have anyone in their life who is not paid to be there EXCEPT for their CASA volunteer.






Foster Care in Contra Costa County



- There are approximately 1,100 children and youth in foster care in Contra Costa County
- In 2015-16 CASA served 144 foster children
- CASA has a strategic plan to serve 400 foster children a year by 2021.
 - Strategic Partnership with Silicon Valley CASA:
 - 6 years ago they served 150 foster children a year.
 - Now they serve 650 foster children a year.


Foster Children Served

Actual 6 months


Projected for 12 months



Five Year Projections




CASA will serve 400 Foster Children/Year by 2021

CASA Financials FY 16-17



- Annual operating budget = \$759,005
- Volunteer in kind Contributions = \$665,672 (2016 Audit)
- Revenue breakdown:
 - 55% Individual Donations
 - 30% Foundations
 - 13% Government
 - 2% Corporations
- Less than 10% is used for fundraising.



Need for Funds



 \$50,000 will allow CASA to recruit, train and support the additional 40 volunteers we need this year to make our goal of serving 185 foster children and youth.
