Sports day was organized on May 22nd & 23rd 2017 at the hospice. It provided an opportunity for the nursing team, doctors and all other employees to participate in multiple sports activities. It was a fun-filled event which sparked excitement and was enjoyed by everyone including the patients.



The advocacy work of Karunashraya continues at local and national level. In early April Dr Nagesh Simha and Dr Jeremy Johnson spoke on “Integrating Palliative care into Oncology” at a day-long CME programme organized by the Cancer Relief Society, the Regional Cancer Hospital, IMA and Snehaanchal Hospice in Nagpur. In May, Dr Johnson also spoke on Ethical Issues in End of life Care at a large meeting organised by the Oncological Society and Palliative Care Centre in Bhopal.

Perhaps most notably, Mr Gurmeet Randhawa, Nagesh and Jeremy participated in a symposium at Mathura, with speakers and attendees from all parts of India and diverse backgrounds. Nagesh spoke on “Spirituality” and Jeremy on “Transitions in care and Non-beneficial treatments” The culmination of this significant and stimulating meeting was the signing of the “Mathura Declaration”, a call to action for ensuring humane care at the end of life. This advocacy was felt to be necessary against a back-drop of inadequate awareness amongst the public, care-providers and policy makers, of the complex issues around compassionate and appropriate care of the dying person. Furthermore it pledged support for the work of CANDID (Citizens Action Needed for Dignity in Death) and ELICIT (End of Life Care in India Taskforce) of which Dr Nagesh Simha is a founding member and leading light. Karunashraya intends to also support and promulgate this work.

### An email from a patients family member.

Hi,

First of all my heartfelt thanks for the support you provide for number of persons who are at the final stage of their life.

We detected that our beloved father has cancer during stage IV. We couldn't beat the strength of this deadly disease even after the surgery, Allopathy / Ayurveda / naturopathy treatments. When our doctor directed us to Karunashraya, we were really worried whether it is easy to get admitted, whether any recommendation is required etc etc.. But when we visited Karunashraya, we were extremely awestruck seeing their Vision, Mission and their work. They admitted my father immediately based on our Doctor's written statement and patient's health condition. My father was there for 2 weeks before his soul departed his human body. During those 2 weeks time, the care which he got at Karunashraya is simply great. Food (served n number of times as per patient's wish), pain management medicines, Qualified Doctors, Kind and caring nurses, entertainment programs, calm and peaceful pleasant environment ... No words to explain.

Whatever the patient asks (food and facilities), it was provided to him/her. Nowhere had I found the “We are serving you free of cost. Don't take advantage of that” attitude. Though my father might have missed us during his last days, I'm sure that we could not have taken care him better than Karunashraya. In the 30 years of my life, the place where I found “Real service to mankind”, the place where I understood the real meaning of the word “Service” is KARUNASHRAYA. Keep up your excellent services.
