### Who We Are

In 2010 The Kookaburra Community School was established offering **free education** to disadvantaged children from an extremely poor part of the Bamburi suburb of Mombasa, Kenya.

The school currently has **139 students** (plus 52 graduates) and employs 16 local staff, including a manager, office worker, 10 teachers, 2 cooks, a cleaner and a security guard.

- 100% of donations go to the project
- Our children survive on around 25 shillings per day
- We provide free education
