Project Components

Our program begins at the community level. Together we are 50/50 partners in the success of this endeavor, each bringing our resources to the table. For Nivas, that means providing **education** so that families learn techniques to build EQresilient homes as set forth by the National Society for Earthquake Technology and the Nepal goverment. This is an opportunity for skill training to benefit the community long-term. Our certified Nepali engineers are teaching EQ-resilient construction workshops to all participants and construction staff. These workshops provide marketable skills while simultaneously increasing the overall safety of future structures in the region.

Our partnership also means providing concrete, steel, corrugated tin, and other **materials** that are otherwise extremely difficult to attain in this remote region for families living in poverty.

And most importantly, we provide on the ground **support** around the clock so that families are able to achieve the completion of their home quickly.

The families in turn provide manual labor, reclaimed materials from their previous home, and vast amounts of dedication. Together Nivas, our donors and the citizens of Dhamku are rebuilding this village stone by stone.

Local Family: Tek, Nirmala & Binisha Bhujel

"When we had no support, no resources, no idea where to begin, we were really scared we would not be able to construct our house again though we wanted to. Without a safe place to stay, we could not really do anything. We could not focus on our farm or any other work. Now getting support from Nivas is helping us build our home so we are very happy. I was worried that we would have to spend all rainy season under a tarp but now we will be living under roof by the help of Nivas."



Impact

Life under a tarp is difficult. It breeds illness, keeps children from their studies and triples the workload for parents constantly needing to maintain the shelter and work harder to make meals. Having a safe home means the families of Dhamkhu can get back to growing their endeavors: planting their fields, studying to make it to graduation, expanding their job skills, working toward a brighter future.
