Curriculum Development

The Classroom Experience (Guided)

- Class participants explore a new topic each week within the classroom environment. Methodology is provided as teachers guide students through each topic in-depth.
 Students are encouraged to think critically and participate actively in discussion on solutions and alternatives.
- Assignments will encourage further exploration of each topic, including social media, volunteer participation, strong focus on empathy and mindfulness exercises, e.g. compassionate (active) listening, role switching, conflict resolution exercises
- Students will be coached to come up with creative ideas to foster dialogue and action.

Immersiveness allows for emotional connectivity

Each segment of Humanity 360 will shine the light on particular globally pressing issues and we will learn about the impacts of this aspect on each featured individual. By gaining intimate and candid insights into the lives of those living under different circumstances, shifts in perspectives about our own surroundings and identifications can occur.

We hope that this experience will be the catalyst for enriched cultural proficiency and enhanced gratitude for one's surroundings and life experiences.

Benefits of Compassion Education

- Emphasis on learning by doing hands-on projects, expeditionary learning, <u>experiential learning</u>
