1.0 BACKGROUND

Rohingya Muslims used to live in the Rakhine State of Myanmar for centuries. They were stripped of their citizenship in 1982 by the military ruler of Myanmar at that time, and made them stateless. Now they are subjected to violent repression at the hands of government forces, Buddhist extremists, and majority Rakhine ethnic group. This time repression started as the conflict between Myanmar security forces and Rohingya militia, which escalated coincidentally when Anan Commission submitted its report to the UN on August 25 2017. In the name of containing the threat of the Rohingya militia, government forces of Myanmar started a brutal attack on the Rohingya Muslims - that initiated a humanitarian disaster.

This time the attack was so brutal and wide that UN was compelled to call it genocide. Initially the authority was denying access to journalist, human right activists, relief workers and others, from visiting this area. However pictures collected by satellite and few internal sources showed the Myanmar military and its cohorts (extremist Buddhists,) burning out the Rohingya houses. The Rohingyas who have crossed the border are saying that the Myanmar military were shooting them on sight. It is difficult to verify the number of casualties, but it is estimated that number may cross 20000.

This time Rohingya Muslims started fleeing to Bangladesh (that started from August 25, 2017) to save their lives. In an estimate, their number has already crossed 500000 (till September 12, 2017) and the number is increasing as more Rohingyas are crossing the border everyday to take shelter in Bangladesh. On the other hand, about 300000 Rohingyas were already staying in Bangladesh – they have been coming here in since 1978. So, a total of 800000 (estimated) refugees are staying in Bangladesh now (as of September 12, 2017).

Noble Laurite in peace Archbishop Desmond Tutu, Dalai Lama and Malala Yousafzai called to Aung San Suu Kyi, the Myanmar leader who is also a Noble Laurite in peace to stop brutal acts against Rohingya Muslims.

The situation is so bad that Archbishop Desmond Tutu could not avoid this situation of the Rohingya Muslim and said in an open letter to Ms Suu Kyi that: "I am now elderly, decrepit and formally

retired, but breaking my vow to remain silent on public affairs out of profound sadness about the plight of the Muslim minority in your country, the Rohingya." The world's most well-known Buddhist icon Dalai Lama said the plight of this minority group made him "very sad". He also called to Aung San Suu Kyi, the Myanmar leader for an end to the violence. Malala Yousafzai has also called on Aung San Suu Kyi act on the "tragic and shameful" treatment to the Rohingya people.

Myanmar military are so brutal that they are using landmines near the border with Bangladesh to harm the fleeing people. Three Rohingya people including two children entered with landmine wounds, confirmed by weapons experts. The Border Guard of Bangladesh also confirmed that their injuries were caused by anti-personnel mines.

The whole world is condemning the atrocities made by Myanmar military and its government.

On the other hand, Bangladesh government is trying hard to provide food and shelter to the Rohingya refugees. Healthcare support is being given through district hospitals. But it is true that it is a difficult and challenging job for the government alone to provide proper water and sanitation facilities or healthcare services needed by the huge number of refugees. UNICEF already expressed its concern that about 200000 children who come here after such a long and challenging journey are sick and they need health care right away.

Our experience shows that death-rate due to lack of proper healthcare support is high among the refugees around the world. Considering the fact, NGF have taken an initiative to set up a mobile clinic to provide primary healthcare support to the Rohingya refugees. It will work under the guidance of government health department and its policy towards the Rohingya refugees.
