- Ahisanang Sechaba is a community based organization, primarily focusing on soccer activities and training as a method of education and skills training for the youth.
- The aim of our organization is provide activities that will deter the youth from drugs, crime and teenage pregnancy
- The initial purpose was to help working mothers (parents) by caring for the children while the parents were at work.



BACKGROUND

- Ahisanang Sechaba was established in June 2011 by Sonti Mofokeng.
- We started off with an under 15 team. One of our highlights was joining the Katlehong Association football (KALFA) league in 2012. We have now grown and expanded to six divisions.

- We aim to eradicate crime in the community. We plan to develop disadvantaged youth and help them become part of the reconstruction process of South Africa.

ORGANIZATION FORMATION

- The organization is formed by committee members guided by the Department of Social Development requirements
- Committee members are parents of the children attending the school which currently runs the center.
- The management structure is built of a chairperson, deputy, general secretary, treasurer and one additional member.
- The organization is governed by the rules of the constitution.
- The center is registered with the department of social development and has appointed an independent accounting firm and legal adviser; Msamanzi Neimud and associates incorporated.
- The center has a practitioner, Sonti Mofokeng.

FINANCIAL CONTROL

- The controls of finances are governed by the terms and conditions of the constitutions.
- The organizations director oversees activities such as:
- The collections and recording of the day care fees
- Liaises with outside stakeholders as well as provide information to fund raisers
- Banking of money received
- Payment of salaries and bills
- Buying of groceries and equipment
- Submitting a monthly and annual financial report to an accounting officer for final audit

ACHIEVEMENTS

- In 2011 our under15 division won the winter tournament hosted by KALFA. In 2012 we hosted the under17 tournament where we had 16 clubs participating. This tournament was sponsored by the Gauteng sport and recreation grant-in-aid. Our team won this tournament.



ACHIEVEMENTS

- We participated in the JOMO COSMOS annual tournament during October of 2012 and 2013.
- In the 2014 & 2015 tournament our under 15 were league runner ups of the KALFA.
- 2015 & 2016 we hosted NELSON MANDELA tournament that was sponsored by UNION OF JEWISH WOMEN and our under 13 division won the tournament.
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ACHIEVEMENTS

- In the year 2015-2016 we won the league with our under 13 then we went to play SAFA REGIONAL PLAY – OFFS.
- In 2015 – 2016 KALFA hosted winter tournament and we got third position with our under 13. We managed to host a volunteer from Italy for six weeks to skill up our team.
- We hosted an Italian, Ricardo Suart, he volunteer for four weeks. He assisted the children with reading, study and attend the library. Due to this we now have volunteers from Wits coming to help tutor and take the children to the library. We have future plans to host more volunteers from around the world to help the children not only love sport but also look love education.
- In February 2013 we hosted a HIV/AIDS workshop which was also sponsored by the Gauteng sports and recreation grant-in aid.
