

ACHEIVEMENT:

Research on Children learning Habits

HIV Prevention Campaign:

HIV/Aids Awareness programs on every Valentine's Day Local communities visited to allow question sessions and increase HIV/Aids Awareness. Behavioral change communication among youth through educational programs in schools.

Monitoring of Health Millennium Development Goals

Conducted survey on the fight against Malaria, child & maternal mortality in four (4) communities in KEEA Districts.

Child Labor /Teenage pregnancy

150 youth went through a focus group discussion in three communities to address adolescent reproductive rights issues

Malaria Awareness Campaign

Malaria Prevention workshops in 10 schools in Elmina Malaria quiz competition for student volunteers in the KEEA Assembly Hall Malaria, Water and Sanitation and HIV/AID's campaign in some selected schools in KEEA municipality with the formation of sanitation clubs in the schools, also the organization of quiz competitions.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITY OF EACH TEAM PARTNER

Project coordinator: The project coordinator is the overall supervisor who is responsible for the entire implementation of the project activities. The project coordinator is responsible for authorization and signing of cheques and contracts. Project coordinator shall supervise the project and ensure proper procurements methods are use in the disbursement of funds. He make sure all daily reports have arrived at the office and monthly and quarterly report is sent to Donor/Partner office.

Project Accountant: The accountant shall be responsible for the recording in flow and out of funds at every level. Again, the accountant shall be responsible for preparation of income and expenditure account of the project. Developing of project budget and Monitoring of bank account. (Inflow and outflow of funds). Ensure proper procurement steps are fulfilled before disbursement of fund. The accountant shall also be responsible for the preparation of the financial accounts. The account shall open all the necessary accounting books for proper financial records.

Programs Officer: The program officer shall be in charge of mobilization of CDD members, this will enable the team to measure the impact of the project in the various communities. The program officer shall again write activity report, evaluation tools to enable the team evaluate the project at every level. The research officer shall compile the daily activity report to write quarterly report in consultation with the project management team members.

Office Secretary: The office secretary shall be responsible for typing of letters, typing of daily report. In addition, will be responsible for writing of minute at the monthly and quarterly meetings and stakeholders meetings.
