The demand is steadily growing by isolated villages, health officials and local governments for the Foundation to expand its health work in other areas. There is great need and we have the experience. What began as small endeavor and dream has turned into a very successful community health program – with potential to grow – not only in the numbers of people we serve but also in the quality of the impact we are having.

Now that the team is a Bolivian Foundation, we can begin to fundraise in Bolivia, primarily through different embassies and international organizations who support community health throughout the country. This is a very positive step forward, and in 2009 we received our first *in-country grant* through the German Embassy; in 2011 we received a follow up grant. The Foundation Director continues to make contacts with various embassies in La Paz, Bolivia. However, the process of securing these grants is a slow one. ***Thus we need continued support from you in order to keep the work going!***
