FAIR AND CARING INTERACTIONS CAMPAIGN

Every year, two public awareness campaigns are carried out, in large part, by teenagers and young adults who come together from a variety of organizations to be trained as advocates of fair and caring interactions.

A Deal for Ideal Interactions

Through a variety of creative activities, teenagers catch adults' attention and challenge them to be symbolically "vaccinated" against violence toward children and adolescents. Adolescents invite adults to commit to being part of a culture of and caring interactions through concrete actions such as listening to, believing, protecting and including children and adolescents, and by speaking up about situations of violence.

Uruguay "Country of Fair and Caring Interactions".

Using a symbolic passport, youth advocates of "fair and caring interactions" invite tourists to join in the prevention of sexual exploitation of children and adolescents. TV ads, pamphlets, local maps, billboards and other methods of communication are used to disseminate the message.

Fair and Caring Interactions Network:

A Network of the Latin American and Caribbean Campaigns for Fair and Caring Interactions. This project seeks to enhance and consolidate the Campaigns currently being carried out in 14 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean. The initiative promotes a culture of fair and caring treatment as a strategic regional approach to a shared problem; abuse of children and adolescents.

The network facilitates the exchange of best practices, training opportunities and creation of teaching materials. It also aids in the development of a common strategy and provides members with wider recognition to increase public advocacy in favor of the rights of children and youth.

The contribution of each individual and organization is fundamental to weave a network of fair and caring interactions that protects thousands of children and adolescents from violence across Latin America.

The fair and caring interactions campaigns began in 2003 and continue to be carried out in multiple countries in Latin America, with the participation of tens of thousands of trained adolescents and educators.
