

Accomplishments from 2013-2016

- 2013 worked with a female student athlete who graduated from a 2 year program at Bryant Stratton transfer to a 4 year program at Grambling State University.
- Provide student with \$6000.00 over 2 years to assist with tuition at Grambling State.
- Purchase over \$1000.00 of textbooks for students.
- 2014 assist a student in their final year with off campus housing saving the family approximately \$4,000.00

Accomplishments continued

- 2014 worked with the Antiguan Consulate in New York with the internship program. To date about 12 students have intern at the office and currently 2 are on staff full time.
- 2015 provide several students with over \$2000.00 to assist with filing for work authorization so that they can complete their OPT (1 year work in the US)
- 2015 collect and distribute \$5000.00 worth of winter clothing to students who were not prepared for the hash winter.

Accomplishments continued

- 2015 spearhead the ABAU School Supply Drive.
- 2016 launch our scholarship and awarded 3 students with \$500.00 each.



Intrinsic values

- Attended graduation ceremonies when family members are unable to attend.
- Assist students finding full and part time jobs.
- 2014 and 2015 students played a significant role in the Independence Service and Gala in NY.
- 2014 and 2015 held a holiday celebration with students staying in NY during Christmas and allow them to record messages to their families in Antigua.

How you can be of assistance

- Donate to the cause. We would like to raise \$10,000.00 in the next 12 months. To meet this goal we are asking individuals to donate a minimum of \$25 per month and businesses to donate a minimum of \$100. per month.


