play:groundNYC is a non-profit organization advocating for young people's rights by providing playworker-run spaces that encourage risk-taking, experimentation and freedom through self directed play.

play:groundNYC operates "The Yard" - a 50,000 square foot adventure playground on Governors Island. We also work with communities to establish their own neighborhood playgrounds and adopt play initiatives.

By providing professional development and consulting services, and training a new generation of playworkers, play:groundNYC is reimagining the urban environment as a place for all children to play, create and explore, regardless of demographic status.
