AN OVERVIEW OF THE TOILET CONSTRUCTION PROJECT

SCINDeA is a Network of 14 field based organisations who have been working with the poor and marginalised communities for the last 21 years in the 3 southern states of Tamilnadu, Andra Pradesh and Karnataka. The Network's vision and mission was formulated in 1996 and revisited in 2006 when it underwent an organisational development process. The guiding principle of the Network is Empowerment of Communities through Peoples Participation.

SCINDeA is registered as a society under the Tamil Nadu Societies Registration Act. It has its own identity and character. It is governed by an Executive Board which is elected by the General Body once in 3 years. SCINDeA since its inception has developed its own structure and systems to ensure social and financial accountability.

The programmatic development interventions have emerged basically from the local communities based on their needs. It is guided by the Common Minimum Development Programme Agenda which include various community development interventions like community organisation, community health, non-formal education, empowerment of women and youth, sustainable organic agriculture and livelihoods. A good rapport has been built with the community. Various categories of CBOs like Multi-purpose Workers, SHGs, Health Cells, Eco Cells, etc., have been organised. The focus of developing CBOs include mobilising, organising and awareness building of the communities along with enhancing capacities and skill of project staff.

The objective of the Toilet Construction Project is to create awareness on the negative consequences and health hazards of open air defecation and improve sanitation by constructing 150 toilets in 10 villages. Alongside health education programmes will be conducted and education materials distributed to poor rural and tribal families.

The programme will be implemented in a participatory manner by households in a village. Preference will be given to women who are members of the Self Help Groups. 150 households are expected to benefit from the project at the end of 6 months at the rate of an average of 4 persons per household.

The positive social and economic benefits of this project include:

- Women will have privacy to defecation
- Incidence of hook worm infection reduced
- Medical expenses related to unhygienic environment reduced
- Surrounding environment will be clean and healthy
- Pregnant women who may need to use toilets frequently will now have access to the same in their own households
- Safety and security of women ensured

The local village committee in each village will:

- Shortlist beneficiaries through a collective decision making process
- Physically verify that the applicant had sufficient space for construction and the

availability of water

- Accept and then submit to the NGO written applications
- Maintain records of financial transactions
- Ensure that the money is used for its intended purpose
- Ensure that at least one family member contributes labour to the toilet construction
- Ensure maintenance of the toilets and proper usage

The stages of Project Implementation

Bringing hygiene and sanitation awareness to all members of a community such that it becomes an accepted part of their thinking requires sustained advocacy over a long period of time and the construction of toilets is only one aspect of the awareness programme. The project process can be separated into three parts.

- 1. In the pre-implementation stage sustained advocacy
- 2. The activity stage where households start to construct toilets
- 3. Post construction, in the third stage, the advocacy must continue to ensure appropriate use of toilets, to reach more people and to create awareness of modern health practices

Monitoring and Evaluation

The SCINDeA Secretariat is the coordinating agency of all projects. At the Secretariat level the Programme Coordinator will coordinate the activities of all 10 areas. He/she will periodically visit the villages and interact with the short listed families and the local village committee members. Additionally the Executive Director of SCINDeA will also visit the 10 project sites.



Livelihood Promotion

The well being of the poorest of the poor is improved through skill training & income generating activities through the active participation of families.


Various skill training programmes like tailoring, driving, computer education etc. are offered to poor students.

Based on the skills available & the needs of the family various income generation activities like goat & cattle rearing, mini eateries petty shops etc. are given to deserving families based on criteria development by SCINDEA.

Community Organisation

SCINDeA attempts to convert its more traditional awareness programmes into a people's movement where the 'process' become a 'product' through

- Formation of village units
- Cadre development
- Capacity building
- Movement building



Child Development

SCINDeA strongly believes in the holistic development of rural and tribal school going & adolescent children. To achieve this SCINDeA organises tuition centres, children's clubs & life skill education both in rural & tribal middle & high schools & in the villages through its partners.

- In the children's clubs children are imparted awareness on gender, environment, climate change, child rights & child protection.
- The life skill education programme sensitizes adolescent boys & girls on health & reproductive issues & how to take the right decision at the right time.
- Through tuition centres most of the children being first generation learners are coached in academics & extra curricular activities







Health & Sanitation

With support from the rural & tribal communities & the local panchayats SCINDeA has constructed low cost toilets thereby benefiting young girls, women, the elderly & the disabled.

Water development through the installation of bore wells have also been undertaken with the support of the community.

Climate Change Initiatives

- In recent years SCINDeA has initiated :
- Climate change education in schools & colleges
- Climate change education in rural & tribal communities
- Formation of Green Clubs
- Promotion of green villages
- 7 partners of the SCINDeA Network have developed Project Design Documents to implement improved cook stoves to mitigate climate change.

Capacity Building of Staff & Communities

Both technical and non technical skills of staff and communities are constantly being improved and upgraded.







Coordination

Central Level

The Secretariat is the coordinating body of the Network. It channels funds to partner organisations and is responsible for both programmes & financial monitoring & coordination.

It also organises for partner organisations of the Network :

- Training programmes both in finance management & programme implementation
- Workshops and seminars
- De-centralised coordination visitation programmes
- Inter-Networking programmes

Cluster Level

On a rotational basis decentralised coordination programme takes place at the cluster level. This promotes a learning & sharing experience. Periodic staff exchange programmes are also organised.

Networking

Networking with like mindied NGO's and organisations is an important activity of the SCINDeA network and it takes place both at the secretatriat and partner organisational levels.



SCINDeA periodically publishes Annual Reports & programme related documents for wider dissemination to NGOs, Govt. Departments & Resource Sharing Agencies.
