## What We Do

Since our inception in 2010, Jenga Jumuiya has provided educational opportunities to children and communities in Tanzania. Our projects have ranged from building classrooms to providing electricity for water systems, from arranging nutritional food delivery to purchasing pencils, from building beds to renovating playgrounds, and much much . Anything that allows a child to have access to better education, we support!

We have recently expanded our service area to include Cameroon and the Caribbean islands and look forward to expanding our operations further as needs arise and funding becomes available.





### **Our Past Projects**

2010: Built two classrooms and a teacher's office at the Oldonyo Sambu Primary School in rural Tanzania. Began supporting our first sponsored student.\*

2011: Delivered school supplies, clothing, mosquito nets and other materials to the students and families of the Oldonyo Sambu, Monduli, Ilkurot districts of rural Tanzania.

2012: Provided weekly fresh fruit and vegetable delivery to Camp Moses Orphanage & School in Arusha, Tanzania.

2013: Sponsored the transportation of 24 Secondary School students to computer training class. Continued support of sponsored students, schools and orphanages in Arusha, Tanzania area.

2014: Completed the construction of a dormitory and provided 100 bunk beds, sheets, blankets, pillows and mosquito nets to the Camp Joshua Orphanage & School in rural Tanzania. Delivered 1500 mosquito nets to area schools, orphanages and clinics.

2015: Planted 200 tree saplings at Oldonyo Sambu Primary School. Continued support of sponsored students, schools and orphanages in Arusha area.

2016: Constructed a classroom and renovated a playground for the Matonyak School in rural Tanzania. Enrolled our eldest sponsor student in University.



2O17: Constructed two classrooms at a brand new school (Lengiloriti) in the Monduli area of Tanzania. Provided electric connectivity to the Matonyak School. Funded the repair of a building foundation at Karim Orphanage. Completed the painting of a dormitory and kitchen at Camp Joshua Orphanage & School.

\*On-going: Since 2010, we have annually supported 5-7 students in Tanzania. Three of our students are now in university or vocational school, and the others are in primary and secondary schools.

## **Our Future Projects**

Tanzania: As we continue to build the Lengiloriti School in Tanzania, we hope to raise enough funds for the construction of more classrooms, a toilet facility and a kitchen for the school in July 2018.

Cameroon: We are currently raising funds for the construction of a primary school classroom in the Ebase district of rural Cameroon, with the hopes of starting construction in early 2018.

Grenada: We are in the process of vetting projects on the island of Carriacou, with the intention of embarking on a project in the Spring of 2018.

US Virgin Islands & Puerto Rico: After the devastating hurricanes that hit the Caribbean in 2017, we are working with local community leaders to identify opportuntities to help with reconstruction and educational support for schools in the region.
