
QUALITY EARLY EDUCATION

- We offer opportunities and fight to close the education gap in early childhood by creating access to child centers where we implement a new and innovative pedagogy in Costa Rica inspired by the Reggio Emilia philosophy.
- The Reggio Emilia philosophy focuses on the **children's rights**, where they are the protagonists: they propose ideas and execute them in their projects with their teachers/facilitators.
- We work under an **eco-systemic model** because we know the importance of the role of the family and community in the children's development. This is why we promote family and community engagement in all of our activities.
- We believe that a child's surrounding is a third teacher, this is why our child centers are always clean
 and aesthetic. We also use the best quality pedagogical materials for the children's projects and the
 walls are full of the documentation where we make the children's thoughts and learning processes
 visible. This empowers the boys and girls, and the families get to understand what their children are
 learning.
- Reggio Emilia celebrates observation, research, experimentation, and analysis regarding their environment. This is how the boys and girls discover – and learn about – the world as it is through an organic, integral and significant manner.
- We incorporate every kind of expression of art in the children's projects through the support of the "Atelierista", who acts as an artistic guide and facilitator for the children and their teachers.
- We develop soft skills/21st century skills, such as teamwork, critical thinking, self-regulation, socialization, conflict resolution, among others in the children so they can become strong and independent human beings.

HIGHLY-NUTRITIONAL ALIMENTATION

- Alimentation is extremely important for the **integral development** for any person, this is why we strive so our boys and girls can receive a high-quality alimentation where at least 80% of their required dairy diet is met in our child centers.
- Each child center has an "Atelier del Sabor" (it translates to "Flavor Workshop" which is the dinning room). It is called this way because it is not only a space where the children eat, but it is a space where they serve their peers, share, and learn.
- Since we offer the care and educational service from 6am-6pm, we provide them with four meals per day: breakfast, snack, lunch, snack. However; we want to be able to give them a fifth meal (dinner) because most of the children that attend our child centers live in poverty and their families do not have the means to provide dinner or a healthy dinner for the whole family.
- We have a nutritionist in our multi-disciplinary team who is in charge of creating the children's menus according to the ages and nutritional necessities of each child.
- Additionally, the nutritionist is in charge of training the "Atelieristas del Sabor" (cooking staff)
 with the best practices regarding the children's alimentation and security in the kitchen.

















ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- Fundación DEHVI's Founder and current Executive Director, Adriana Alfaro Fuscaldo, began researching best practices for early childhood in 2006. In 2010 she constituted under Costa Rican law: Fundación DEHVI where she received a seed grant from the Multilateral Investment Fund of Inter-American Development Bank. In 2014 began the operation of the first two child centers in San Juan de Dios and Loto 3 de Desamparados due to a Cooperation Agreement with the Municipality of Desamparados. Later, in June of that same year, we began operating the third child center in La Libertad de Pavas with the Municipality of San José with a Cooperation Agreement as well. In May 2015 we began operating our fourth child center in Hatillo 2 with the same Municipality. And in April of 2018, we made Cooperation Agreement with the Municipality of Alajuelita where we recently began operating our fifth child center.
- By 2020, our goal is to benefit 1000 children directly by operating more child centers.
- We have a Support and Services Center where a multidisciplinary team works in order to support the
 operation of the child centers. This team is made up from different professionals in the following areas:
 accountability, education, human resources, fundraising, executive direction, communication,
 engineers, among others.
- However, we also have a multidisciplinary team that works directly in the child center that is made up
 of social workers, a nutritionist and psychologist. We only have one psychologist for the moment, but we
 need to work with more psychologists, because of the increasing necessity due to the communities
 where we work.
