To promote **social** and **economic development** in vulnerable neighborhoods through strategies that promote **equality of opportunity** and permit people to be protagonists in their own growth.




Our Vision

Training and Microloans for Entrepreneurs

The objective of this program is **to develop entrepreneurial skills in the women** of the neighborhoods we work in so that they can solidify their business plans, achieving greater independence and autonomy, and consequently, personal empowerment.

We offer them **training, financing, and counseling** so that they can start or strengthen a commercial activity that permits them to generate extra household income.

Since 2000, we have awarded **1699 microloans**, with a total of **\$1,229,148** pesos, to promote entrepreneurship, and **490 women** have graduated from the entrepreneurship management course “Enterprising Women.”



Emprende Services

Skill Building

We offer a **skill-building course** on entrepreneurship management (cost structure, personal finances, marketing, advertising, etc.) The aim is to provide guidelines to the participants so that they can plan and succeed in running their own businesses.

Microloans

We provide **small loans with low interest rates** that allow women to start commercial, production, or service activities. By receiving loans, the participants can put their business plans into action by purchasing supplies, tools, and materials. These funds can be renewed once the original loan is paid back.

Advising

We provide an **advisor** who accompanies the entrepreneur continuously through the evolution of her enterprise. Through weekly meetings, the entrepreneurs receive personalized follow-up and have the opportunity to share experiences with and learn from other enterprising women.
