# HIGHLIGHTS OF 2017

#### ARUNA

One of our volunteers ran a crowdfunding campaign with her friends and family to raise funds for an electric wheelchair for Aruna who lives at Anandapura Farm. The wheelchair arrived in August and Aruna is now confident at using it and particularly enjoys an early morning ramble around the farm. Thanks to all those who supported Aruna in further developing his independence!



#### IMPROVING INFRASTRUCTURE

Kind supporters helped with funding for a fence around the playgroup at Ambasevena, one of the residential buildings at Cotagala, and an improved clothes rinsing area for the Infants Home. There is further building work going on at the moment to build a ramp for the new Cotagala School building and also to repair the roof of the main residential building at Cotagala, which is over 100 years old. Thanks to those who supported us with these projects.



#### COFFEE CULTIVATION

The Siloam Centre in Korea gave some funding this year to expand coffee cultivation at Asokapura Farm. Due to the continued low price of rubber across Sri Lanka, which has continued for a number of years, we are currently considering the long-term sustainability of Asokapura Farm and looking at other farming options that will continue to generate much needed income for us and increase our sustainability.



#### TRAVELS ABROAD

As well as visits and travel around Sri Lanka, those who live with us have also had the opportunity to travel abroad this year. Priyanka, Suba, Kusuma, Chandani and Deepika travelled to Bangladesh this year for the AFID conference. This year's theme was acceptance, accessibility and inclusion. Anushka, Chamilika, Mary, Rehara, Maria and Surangika performed in India at SAMBHAV, an inclusive arts event, and Rasanjalee went to Dubai to participate in the Asian Youth Para games.



# PREETHI'S STORY

Preethi can often be seen entertaining those she cares for with songs and music. At other times, she is in the garden - tidying, planting and watering. She has endless energy and enthusiasm in these tasks, but beneath her smile are the memories of the difficult times she has faced in her life.

Preethi was abandoned and brought to Prithipura as a small child. She remembers trips to the beach, attending school with her friends and learning how to tap rubber, cultivate vegetables and grow pepper, cocoa and coffee at Asokapura Farm.

When she was older, she decided to leave Asokapura Farm and live independently. She married and had two children. She farmed in two areas of Sri Lanka, growing enough to sustain her and her family. She also worked in Saudi Arabia for 4 years and speaks fondly of this time where she was well looked after by the family she worked for.

While in Saudi Arabia, she was informed that one of her sons had died on active service in the army at the age of just 19. Preethi talks about how the events nearly broke her and how she still misses her son greatly. When further tragedy struck and her husband died, Preethi still somehow found it in herself to go on. It became difficult to stay on the land she owned. She decided to sell up, move to Columbo with her other son and start again. While looking for work, she came back to visit Prithipura and agreed to work with us.

And so she is back, and Prithipura and those who live with us are all the better for it. She says being at Prithipura feels like the right thing to do. She says she feels those she cares for are like her own children and after some extremely difficult years is enjoying the life she leads.

Preethi attributes her remarkable resilience and courage to her upbringing at Prithipura. Despite the tragedies in her life, her story is also rare considering her childhood circumstances. It is a story of independence and the freedom and ability to make choices.

## MEDICAL SUPPORT AT THE INFANTS HOME
