Reaching out to poor rural community children with scholastic materials is one of the key activities of Hope for Children's Health Foundation in Uganda. Children attending school in Rural Communities of Uganda especially in Kyangwali village face a great number of challenges like: inadequate materials to use at school,

limited food, walking long distances, failure to pay school fees and limited clean and safe water resources, among others which hence leads to school drop outs.

On 16th February 2019, we reached out to over 24 orphans and vulnerable children in Kyangwali village with scholastic materials like: Pens, Pencils, Exercise Books, rubbers, rulers, sharpeners, tooth pastes (to ensure that they have what to use while in class to avoid school drop outs), and other items like sanitary pads for young girls, and washing soap (for proper menstrual hygiene management and better health outcomes). The funds which were used to purchase these items were received through global giving from our beloved friends and well-wishers from around the world.
