

Komo Learning Centres (KLC) was established in 2009 as a non-profit organization 501 (c) (3). We take a holistic approach to community development with an emphasis on education, health, and sustainable livelihoods. KLC is currently engaged in a number of projects that directly impact over 20,000 people per year in Uganda.



Livelihoods

KLC, in partnership with MCE Uganda, began implementation of the Leadership, Entrepreneurship, and Apprenticeship Program (LEAP) in 2014. Over 1,000 young people per year participate in this 12-month training course that focuses on leadership, vocational and entrepreneurship development, and post program support.

Youth-Led Programs

Our dedication to youth empowerment and ownership led us to create the Komo Youth-Led Club (YLC) for out of school youth and the Do It Yourself Clubs (DIY) for secondary schools students. In both programs youth are the drivers of all activities, while KLC staff act as facilitators. Young people in these clubs have chosen to focus on peer health education, dance and drama, and entrepreneurship.





Health

KLC launched the Nama Wellness Community Centre in 2014 to provide quality, affordable healthcare to the community. We offer a comprehensive set of primary care services and also specialize in maternal and child health, family planning, cervical cancer screening and treatment, and dental care. We provide services both within our clinic and on outreaches into hard-to-reach areas of the community. In 2017 we had over 10,000 patient visits at our clinic!
