Since 2017, when we experienced an earthquake that damaged our homes and our safety, we have been working to rebuild our lives and create the necessary conditions so that accidents do not affect us so deeply.



The COVID 19 pandemic has limited the holding of general meetings, however, we are sharing with other colleagues the eco-technologies that we have learned because we now know that this improves our health and the life of everyone in the community, as is the case of the wood-saving stoves.



Fortunately, the CODICE team gave us the training in good time and we installed the cocoa production nursery and now we are taking turns to attend to it and the plants are growing and soon they will be ready to take them to the fields to plant interspersed with coffee cultivation.







In our community there is no presence of the virus of COVID -19 and we hope to keep our families healthy, and even when we have few financial resources, we do everything possible to stay calm, eat well and maintain the necessary care. Meanwhile we prepare to improve agricultural jobs and improve the economy.
