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Message from Founder/CEO

ear Friends, I am very happy to present to you the Ask The Paediatricians Foundation's News Magazine for the Year 2019.

Ask The Paediatricians Foundation started on July 20, 2015 as a Facebook group by a passionate Paediatrician whose desire is to put an end to child deaths due to ignorance, by providing evidence-based health education. What started as a one woman mission grew tremendously and metamorphosed into an award-winning foundation that is impacting thousands of children and their parents all over Nigeria, Africa and beyond.

Ask The Paediatricians Foundation became incorporated and formally registered with the Corporate Affairs Commission of Nigeria in July 2017. Ask The Paediatricians Foundation is committed to reducing preventable child deaths in Nigeria by providing evidence-based health education online and offline through free community medical outreaches to indigent children in under-served communities in Nigeria who have limited access to healthcare professionals and facilities.

The year has been an intense one and I am happy to showcase the tremendous growth Ask The Paediatricians Foundation experienced in the year. In 2019, Ask The Paediatricians Foundation spread her tentacles across all states in Nigeria.

Our annual May Children's Day Community Medical Outreaches and October Independence Day Medical Outreaches reached out to over 30,000 beneficiaries across the country. This feat was accomplished from the Facebook Community Leadership Programme (FCLP) which came with our highest funding ever—a grant award of 50,000 USD.

Beyond medical outreaches, we also secured our National office space in Surulere, Lagos and procured a bus for our mobile clinics. We had our first set of paid project staff as a result of the funding from Facebook Community Leadership Programme (FCLP) from January to September 2019. We launched our first version of the ATP Mobile App where parents can get direct and quick answers to their child health questions and read our topical child health articles as well from their mobile phones at no cost. Within three months of its launch, we had about 2000 downloads. The feedback from the various beneficiaries of our programmes both online and offline have been amazing.

This shows that with the right support and funding, there is no limit to what we can achieve in ATP. I am so grateful to our volunteers and donors who gave time, money and skills to make the year 2019 an amazing one.

We were able for the first time to have our Social Impact Analysis survey done by the Azao-conteil Consulting firm with support from Facebook.

We have had so many other wins during the year. We became a full partner and member of Global Giving which is the largest fundraising platform for non-profits all over the world. We were one of the organizations featured on their social media page as part of our participation in their March 2019 Accelerator programme.

We have been vetted by Global Giving as an Effective Organization among other badges. We have consistently sent quarterly reports to our donors via Global Giving page. ATP won the Social Media for Social Good Africa Award in January 2019. We are also the winner of the Nimbus Nominate A Charity where we got the equivalent of N5Million naira worth of publicity in all the Shopping malls where Nimbus Media have their displays all over the country. It is my pleasure to invite you to read through and enjoy our wonderful year in pictures.

Free Online Health Education

Ask The Paediatricians Foundation has organized more than 100 successful Community Medical Outreaches nationwide since our first outreach in 2016 and has reached more than 50,000 children. BREASTFEEDING WEEK 2019

Ask The Paediatricians group joins the world in celebrating breastfeeding week from 1^{st} August every year.

The celebration this year themed 'Empower Parents, Enable Breastfeeding' was filled with fun activities for the week. The event kicked off with an open discussion for members to ask questions on breastfeeding. The CEO, Dr. Gbemisola Boyede, hosted a watch party on breastfeeding videos to enlighten, teach and guide mothers that might be struggling or having issues on any aspect of breastfeeding, i.e. when and how to initiate breastfeeding in the first 24 hours after birth, attaching baby to the breasts, how to handle nipple and breast pain, storing/preserving breast milk, how to express breast milk etc.

Dr. Boyede anchored a live discussion on breastfeeding and lectured extensively on all breastfeeding-related issues after which a question and answer session followed to give room for members to ask questions.

Members had the opportunity to celebrate their exclusively breastfed babies as well. They posted pictures of their babies, shared challenges encountered, feedback and also shared some words of encouragement to help other members that might be struggling with breastfeeding, i.e. some mothers were able to know that twin babies can be exclusively breastfed, breastfeeding can equally be achieved up to 2 years and beyond etc.


Breastfeeding quiz was also organised to promote and re-educate the members on breastfeeding and its importance. The quiz was held in 2 stages. In the first stage, 10 winners were picked based on MCQs (Multiple Choice Questions) highest scores after which the top 5 proceeded to the second stage. This stage was done via a live session where the participants were expected to answer the questions correctly, and with the fastest finger. It is worthy to note that the top 10 winners received an Ask The Paediatricians Foundation Magazine each. The first 3 winners however received along side, mouthwatering gifts.


The first received 5000 naira recharge voucher, and an Ask The Paediatricians branded bag.

2019 SUMMARY REPORT FOR CHILDREN'S DAY **OUTREACHES AND ATP GOES TO SCHOOL**

In 2019, ATP organized Children's Day outreaches between May and June, and organized Independence Day Outreaches termed "ATP GOES TO SCHOOLS" in the month of October

These various events were organized by hundreds of ATP volunteers across the country, reaching out to hundreds of schools and over 30,000 children.

The events were funded with donations from individuals and corporate bodies. Donations came in the form of financial gifts, medicines, food, snacks, drinks, clothes, venues, shoes and so on.

For the Children's Day Outreaches in May and June, state volunteers either invited parents and their kids to meet at a school or community ground. The events had paediatric doctors, nurses, pharmacists, laboratory scientists, dieticians and other allied health care practitioners on ground to give medical/dental consultations, check nutritional status, mass de-worming and give free drugs. Healthy meals and gift items were also distributed to the kids.

For the ATP Goes To Schools events in October, state volunteers visited various schools where they had health talks and demonstrated lifesaving personal hygiene hacks for the students and pupils. The various schools also got gifts of First Aid kits and sanitary wares.






ATP ANNIVERSARY







ATP Live is a video livestreaming programme on the Ask The Paediatricians Page and Group simultaneously. Over 20 topics were discussed during the year 2019.



We hope you like this new look for ATP.




ATP GROUP DISCUSSIONS FOR THE YEAR


hild health education and intelligence are promoted continuously through our group discussions, and not less than two discussions were held monthly this year. Participating members during the discussions were allowed to ask questions related to the topic.

These health discussions are organised for members to have access to it anytime they need information on the subject of discussion.

We held group discussions on various health topics by different professionals this year, and we were able to organise about 35 group discussions ranging from topics on Complementary Feeding, Oral Health, Allergic Rhinitis, Genitourinary tract infection in children, Diarrhoeal diseases, Rheumatic fever, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Puberty, Malaria, Measles, Appendicitis in children, Down Syndrome, Anaemia, Tuberculosis, Prenatal and Antenatal care, Prevention of mother to child transmission of Hepatitis B virus, Oral habits and how to break them, Childhood poisoning, Prematurity, People living with disabilities etc.



ASK THE PAEDIATRICIANS FOUNDATION FCLP PROJECT

Thanks to the fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) grant award we received from the Facebook Community Leadership Programme (FCLP), ATP was able to establish state chapters in 33 states and the FCT Abuja, and pilot mobile clinics were established in four indigent communities in Lagos State, Epe, Ijegun, Makoko, and Oworo.

Also, from the grant money, ATP procured a national office space with paid project staff together with a bus for the mobile clinics, and we were able to launch the first version of the ATP mobile app.



CHALLENGE:

The Nigerian health system is highly inefficient:

- The health workforce is concentrated in urban tertiary health care services delivery in the southern part of the country, particularly in Lagos*
- Densities of nurses, midwives and doctors is too low to effectively deliver essential health services (1.95 per 1,000)*
- In 2016, Nigeria spent just 3.65% of its national budget on health*

ATP'S RESPONSE:

ATP thrives to provide every child with basic health care,

by empowering parents and offering free access to treatment to the most vulnerable children.



Educate parents about a health practices

Medical professionals share on the Facebook page evidencebased good health practices (how to carry medical treatments, nutrition, etc.), raising awareness about the danger of malpractices and self-medication

99% of ATP's parents and care givers declare they have a better knowledge of good health practices for their child'

96% of ATP's parents and care givers declare they have changed their health practices (they stopped self-medication and started going to the doctor's/hospital when their child is sick)*

Providing free access to quality health care

During outreaches, volunteers reach the most vulnerable communities, delivering free diagnostics, medical treatment, and medicine

86% of ATP's parents and care givers declare ATP is the actor they trust the most and that they first contact if they need information on their child's health*

46 outreaches have been organized in 33 states and Federal Capital Territory Abuja

26,141 children attended a Community Medical Outreach and 1,000 received care via the mobile clinic

Improving medical professionals' skills

ATP offers medical professionals a ground to reinforce their skills, to train residents, and to collect data on health, thereby pushing forward research on child health

87% of ATP's medical professionals declare they have reinforced their professional skills (by collecting data for research, participating to corporate workshops, gaining professional experience, gaining knowledge about child health, etc.)*

59% of ATP's medical professionals declare new patients came to visit their medical practice*

M CHALLENGE:

- Nigeria is one of the most ethnically diverse countries. There are some 250 ethnic groups, with the Hausa-Fulani, Yoruba and Igbo making up 70%.
- In 2018, 44% of the Nigerian population lived in extreme poverty (World Poverty Clock)

ATP'S RESPONSE:

ATP bonds members and beneficiaries across the country by raising awareness on health issues and promoting volunteering. Its decentralized organization reinforces self-fulfillment, individual skills and team work.
