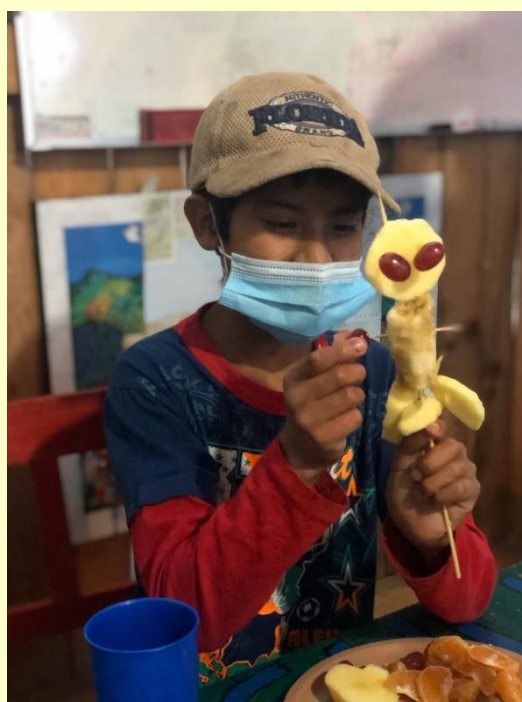


We made it to the end of the year!
