Over 40% of Teachers in Public Schools are Not Qualified




2,100 Children will pass Through ONE Teacher in 35 Years

81% of teachers assessed in three core subjects failed Mathematics.



Continuous class-based Monitoring and Mentoring - to assess effect of training of teaching quality Local Content - Training Faculty is made up of well exposed Nigerian teachers. Outstanding teachers from the programme are also reabsorbed

Pupils Centered - it measure the overall change in performance of the students







# CITPPST 2018 – KEY OUTCOME: IMMEDIATE EFFECT OF TRAINING ON TEACHERS








#### **CITPPST 2018 – KEY OUTCOME:**

# 2019/2020 CITPPST Programme Outlook



## **Training Goals for 2019**



Engage 750 teachers in a yearlong training programme to improve their capacity to deliver quality education



Equip 300 teachers (75 per LGEA) with the right knowledge and teaching methodology in Mathematics



Empower 150 School Managers from 100 public primary schools with skills in Instructional Leadership and Mentoring for the teachers under them



Train 500 teachers in digital literacy (using Computers and Smart Phones) to enhance lesson preparations and teaching



#### **KEY IMPROVEMENTS IN THE 2019/2020 PROGRAMME**

- 1. Training will target over 700 teachers from 75 public primary schools. Over 400% increase in reach compared to 2018
- Competitive selection process that will involve the Education Secretaries and School Managers
- 3. Decentralized trainings 5 LGEAs will host 2019/2020 trainings
- 4. Use of biometrics for enrollment, data capture and punctuality monitoring of participants
- 5. Absorption of qualified and eligible 2018 CITPPST Graduate into the 2019 faculty
- 6. 40% of trainings will hold online in order to build online affinity of teachers
- 7. Monitoring and evaluation of programme impact will be recorded electronically and will cover 40% of the benefiting population from 25% in 2018
- 8. School Managers will be trained specially in the BAF School Leadership Programme (SLP)
- 9. Up to 50% of the target population will pass through the BAF Subject Enhancement Programme in Mathematics (SEP-M)
- 10. Training will be session-based instead of running from January till December
