### Process

Reintegration is the process through which children formerly associated with armed forces/groups are supported to return to civilian life and play a valued role in their families and communities.



### Things to consider

Being accepted by one's family and community is the most important measure of success in reintegration of children. To achieve this, children will participate in positive community activities giving them a valued social role, which will enhance their recovery and well-being.



### Our Impact

Working with local organizations, we will develop reintegration projects tailored to the community and its resources. Communities will be supported in literacy and numeracy classes for all children and develop youth clubs and other social activities.



### What else can be done...

We will advocate strongly for child protection agencies to increase the quantity and quality of reintegration programs in South Sudan. We will engage the UN, governments and local NGOs to collectively develop new reintegration programs. Additionally, we will build initiatives to obtain life-long funding from private donors.
